**Scandinavian, German Cookies for Holiday Eating Are Old Timers**

The Scandinavians are great ones to make small cakes (cookies to us) for holidays, and one of the favorites for most any time of year are fatigmand or "poor man's cookies," which may have been for poor men in the old days but certainly not now.

**FATIGMAND**

- 10 egg yolks and 7 egg whites
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup thick cream
- 1 tablespoon melted butter
- Flour to roll out
- 2 teaspoons cardemon

Beat eggs together, with sugar

until very creamy and light. Add unbeaten cream and remaining ingredients, with flour enough to make a stiff dough. Roll out very thin, cut in triangles, cut a slit in the center and pull one end of triangle through it. Fry a very light brown in deep fat.

The next recipe is one supposed to have been made by the Capuchin monks and is really a cookie though it's called

**CAPUCHEN BREAD**

- 1 cup sugar
- 7 eggs
- 2 ounces bitter chocolate
- 1/2 cup unblanched almonds
- 1/2 cup grated peel
- 1/2 cup flour
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves

Beat sugar and eggs as for sponge cake, add melted chocolate and coarsely chopped nuts, peel and then add flour. Bake in a 10x12 greased pan for 40 minutes in a moderate oven. Cut in squares 1 1/2 x 2 1/2 inches.

Then there's the old world specialty, Lebkuchen, which was a "must" at Christmas in old Germany.

**LEBKUCHEN**

- 4 whole eggs
- 2 cups light brown sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 ounces citron, cut fine
- 1/4 pound almonds, cut fine

Beat eggs well, add sugar gradually and beat again. Mix flour and cinnamon with chopped nuts and citron. Combine two mixtures. Bake in flat greased pans at 375 degrees and when cool cut in strips about 5 inches long, frosting with pink or white icing before removing from pan.
