Following a covered dish dinner, readings were given by Mrs. Hammer, Mrs. Edwin Ruby, Mrs.

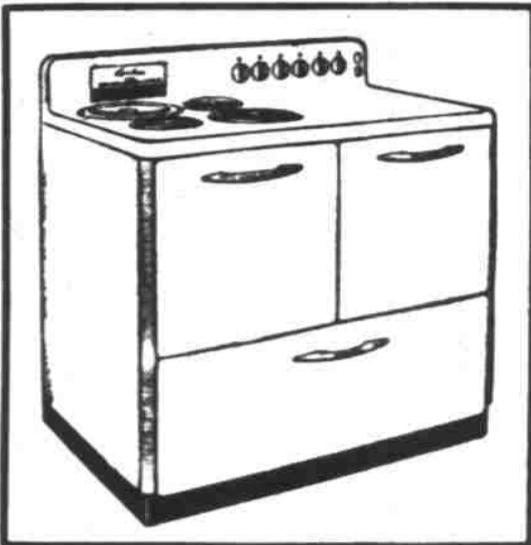
Crane, Mrs. Marvin Overholts. Gifts were exchanged.
