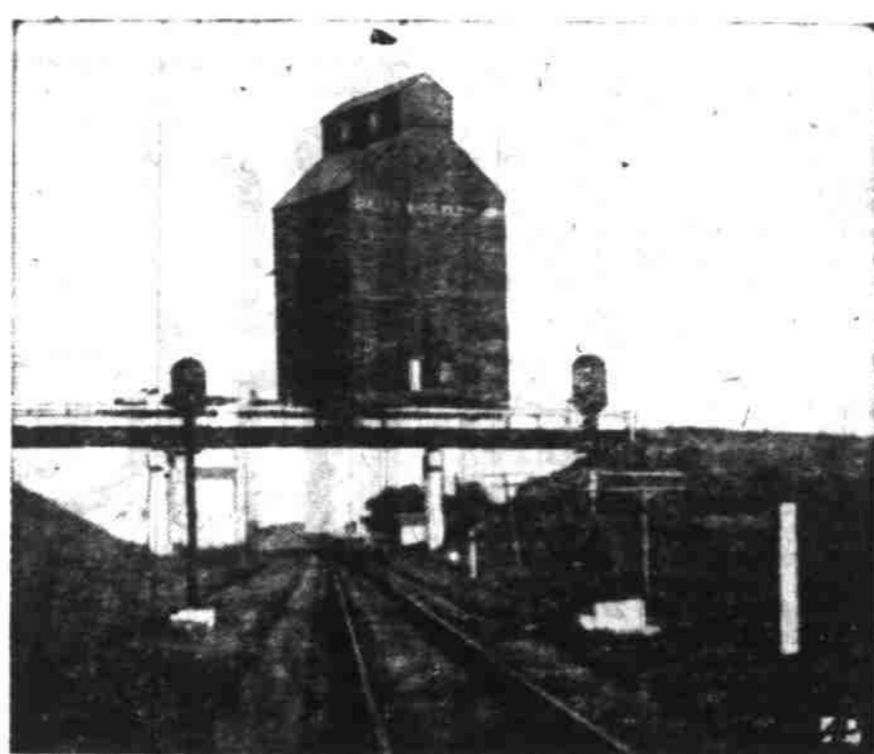


TURKEY PRICE DROPS
