Largent was born at Matfield Green, Kans., Jan. 1, 1877. He was married to Myrtle Handy, Sept. 29, 1898. The couple came to Oregon in 1912, settling in Marshfield and later living in Eugene before coming to Salem in 1936.

For 10 years they operated the grocery store at 17th and Chemeketa streets, retiring two years ago. Largent was a member of the Jason Lee Methodist church.

Survivors besides his widow are a daughter, Marie L. Olson, Salem; brother, Bruce Largent, Matfield Green, Kans.; and half-brother, Ross Largent, Seattle.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 1:30 p. m. in the Clough - Barrick chapel for B. Howard Largent, 71, late resident of 1695 Chemeketa st., who died Thursday morning at a local hospital. The Rev. Louis Kirby will officiate, with private services at Mt. Crest Abbey mausoleum.

To defy freedom as an end itself always means trouble warned Bishop Gerald Kennedy of the Methodist church in an address before the Salem Lions club Thursday noon in the Marion hotel.

The Methodist bishop for this area and several other clergymen attending a Salem district Methodist conference were guests of the club at its luncheon meeting.

Bishop Kennedy declared freedom without a foundation of duty and obligation soon turns to license, "which is the worst slavery of all." He urged his listeners to reestablish spiritual values by doing the hard work of "digging the coal of character."

World unity depends on common worship before a common God, and it has already become apparent that modern advances in trade and transportation and education cannot achieve this unity, the bishop asserted.
