Dayton Legion Plans Memorial

DAYTON, Dec. 18 — War Memorial building is planned for Dayton according to plans announced by the Dayton American Legion post this week. Delegation of legionnaires appeared before the Lions club and outlined the proposed method of financing the project to cost an estimated \$25,000.

Plans are a one story building 60 by 100 feet with full basement, at Fourth and Alder streets. Present at the meeting were Louis Schultz, post commander, and members, John Shelbourne, Milton Murphy, Leonard Hickerson, Ernie Beickel and Merlin Merrill. The plan is for a building of pumice or concrete blocks. Basement would have a meeting room, dining room and kitchen, with skating rink and dance floor on first floor.

Building would be financed by debenture bonds, non-interest bearing and with no due date. Between \$2,000 and \$4,000 will be available from the Yamhill County court and is to be used for repayment of the bonds. It is planned to have much of the work to be donated which will keep construction cost at a minimum.

Wreckers Clearing Corner of North Church and Chemeketa

The former F. G. Delano residence at 292 N. Church st., which now is being wrecked, is a house with a history. It was built about the year 1867 by Eugene Breyman, of the firm of Breyman Bros., leading merchants in Salem's early years. It stood at the Court street corner of the block where the Texaco service station now stands — at the northeast corner of Court and Church.

In it were born Mrs. R. P. Boise, who now resides at 795 N. Summer st., and her sister, the late Mrs. Charles L. McNary, wife of Oregon's well-known senator.

About 1881, Mr. Breyman decided to build a new house. As he wrecked the Chemeketa street corner of the block. While it was on rollers out in Church street.

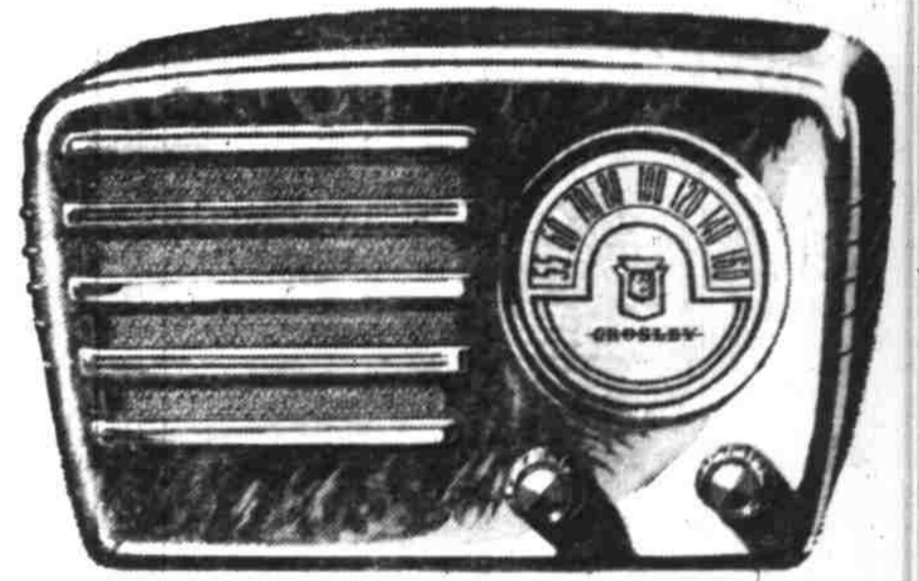
