 HOLLYWOOD, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Oscar Keith, 34, of Munster, Ind., tonight won the "Mr. and Mrs. Hush" contest on the National Broadcasting company's "Truth or Consequences" program. He correctly identified the mystery couple as Velox and Yolanda, the dance team.

**Carl Harden On Probation For 5 Years**  
 Carl Melvin Harden, 23, charged with shooting his cousin, Clifford Harden, following a dispute at Gates last August 24, was placed on five years' probation Saturday by Marion County Circuit Judge George Duncan.

**Changed Plea**  
 Harden has been confined in Marion county jail since the shooting, on a charge of assault with a dangerous weapon. He originally pleaded innocent to the charge, but changed his plea to guilty November 13. Originally he was charged with assault with intent to kill, but the charge was reduced.

**Testifies to Fight**  
 Harden, testifying Saturday, said his cousin had beaten him several times prior to their fight and that he was protecting himself when the shot was fired. He stated that his cousin advanced on him and attempted to wrestle the gun from his hands when the weapon discharged.

**State police testified** the youth made no attempt to resist them when they arrived on the scene to make the arrest. Others said there was only one bullet in the rifle and only a single shot fired. Witnesses said both men were drinking at the time.

**Several witnesses verified** Harden's statement that his army record of four years had been spotted. Harden told the court he had been awarded several medals for outstanding service in combat and had been discharged in 1947 with a pension for 50 per cent disability for injuries suffered in battle.
