LESLIE JUNIOR HIGH

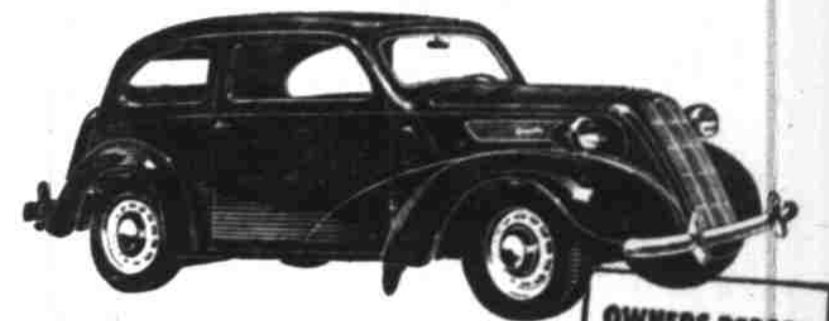
