Business Loans Show Increase

WASHINGTON, Dec. 29 (AP)—Business loans by federal reserve member banks in the nation's leading cities increased \$19,000,000 during the week ended December 22, the federal reserve board reported today.

The rise, the second in a row after a four-week decline in November and early September, sent total business loans by these banks to a new record high of \$15,614,000,000.

Real estate loans, up \$4,000,000 for the week, also reached a new record high, \$4,070,000,000.

Stock Market Rebounds with Large Gains

NEW YORK, Dec. 29 (AP)—The stock market rang up one of the largest winning scores of the month today.

Gains of fractions to two points or so were posted in a quick reversal which more than wiped out Tuesday's losses. The average loss Tuesday was the sharpest of the month.

The direction of the market was cloudy at the start of trading. For the rest of the day, though, the price curve slowly turned upward. Closing quotations in many cases were at the day's tops.

Turnover of 1,380,000 shares has been topped only once this month, when 1,650,000 shares changed hands yesterday.

Some of the best gains were made in the radio and television, motion picture, oil, chemical and railroad sections, but on the whole plus signs were liberally distributed through the list.

Optimistic brokers hailed the rally as the long-awaited start of an end-of-the-year advance. Buying today was scarcely aggressive, some said, but tax selling diminished and prices responded to only moderate demand.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced of one point to 64.7, largest gain since an advance of a full point on December 1.

Of the 1,111 issues which sold, 649 advanced and 230 declined.

Grain Market Drifts Lazily

CHICAGO, Dec. 29 (AP)—Grains drifted lazily along to a close with small gains and losses on the board of trade today.

May wheat and corn showed a little strength at times, largely result of support from cash issues. Otherwise, price changes were held to small fractions and nothing happened at any time to disturb the general lassitude.

Selling came mainly in small lots from commission houses. It never bulked large and got the better of the market only in early dealings, when all cereals were down fractionally.

Wheat closed 1/4 lower to 1/2 higher, corn was 3/8 lower to 1/2 higher, oats were unchanged to 1/4 lower, rye was 1/2 higher, soybeans were 3/8 lower to 1/4 higher and lard was 2 to 7 cents a hundred pounds higher.

Additional export flour sales to Italy and Norway were reported and mills purchased a little wheat.
