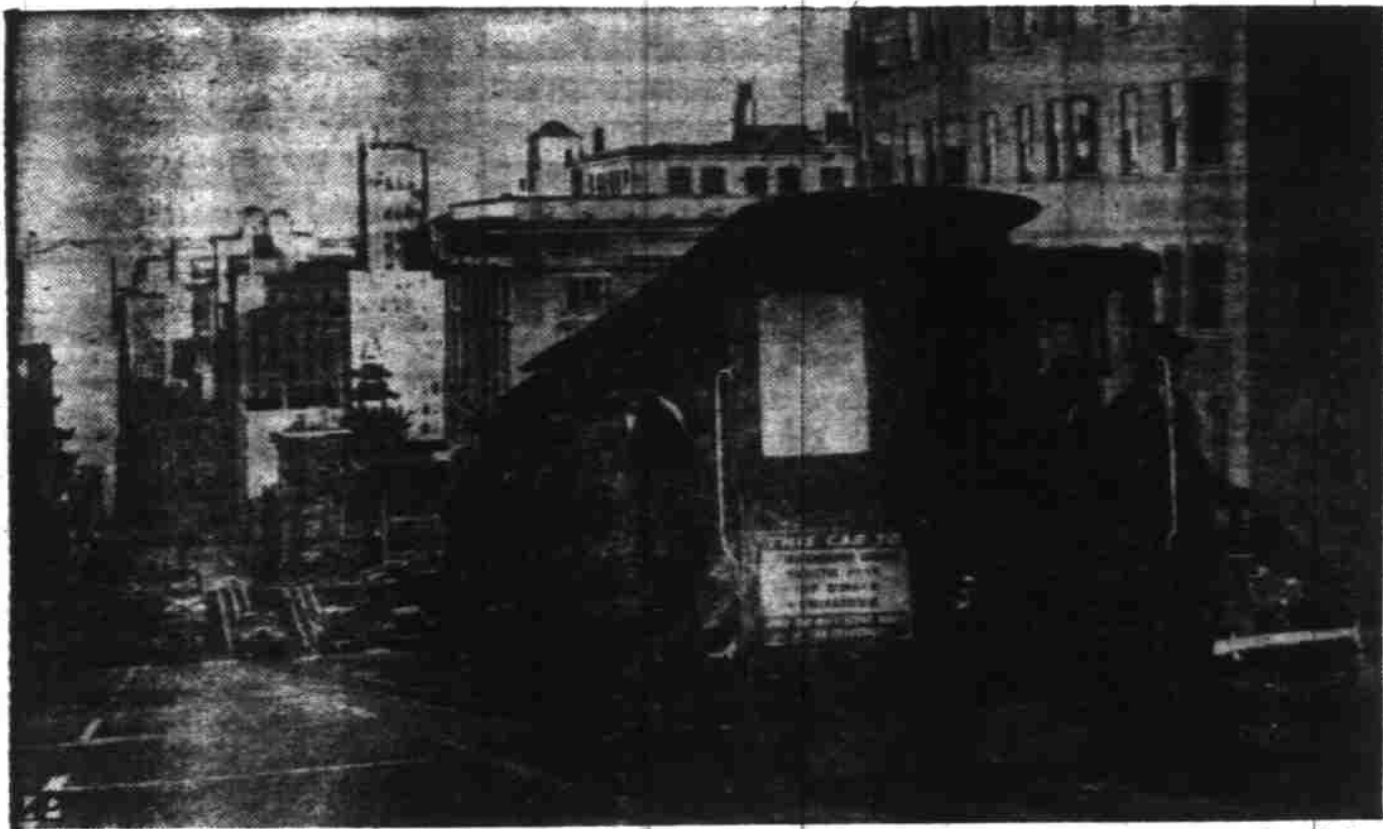


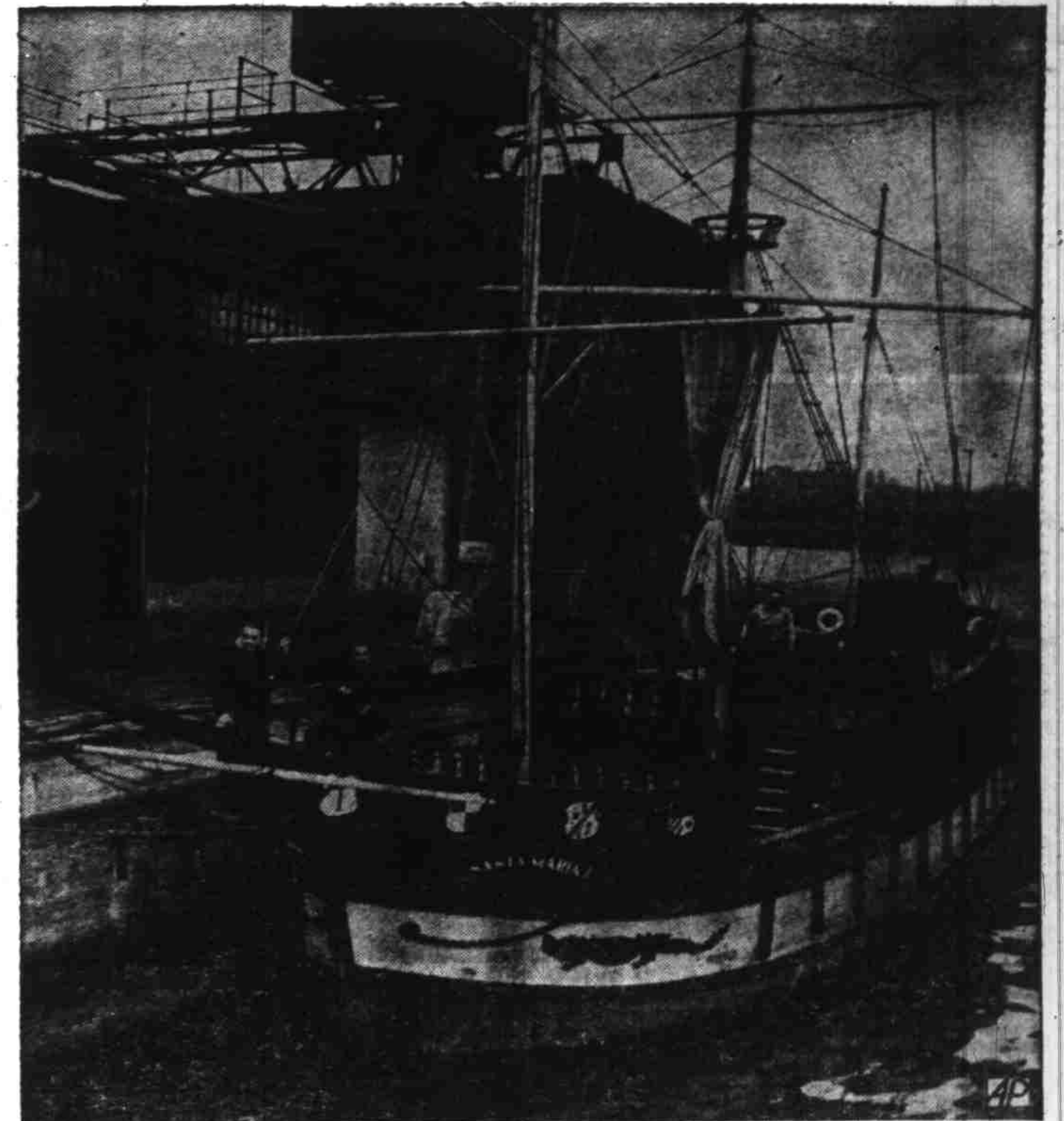

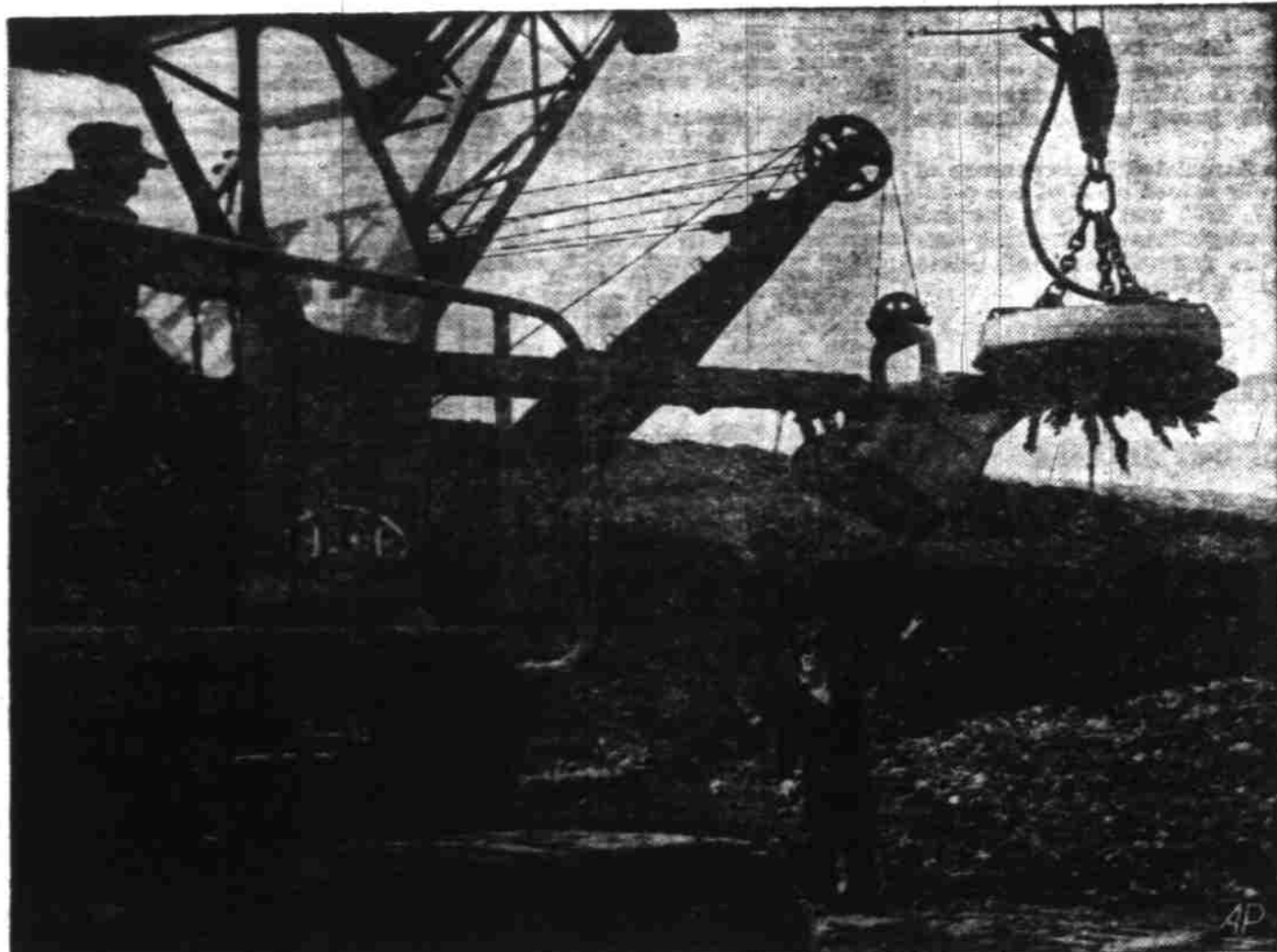
CAPITOL SNOW SCENE—Snow brightens grounds and caps dome of national capitol in Washington.



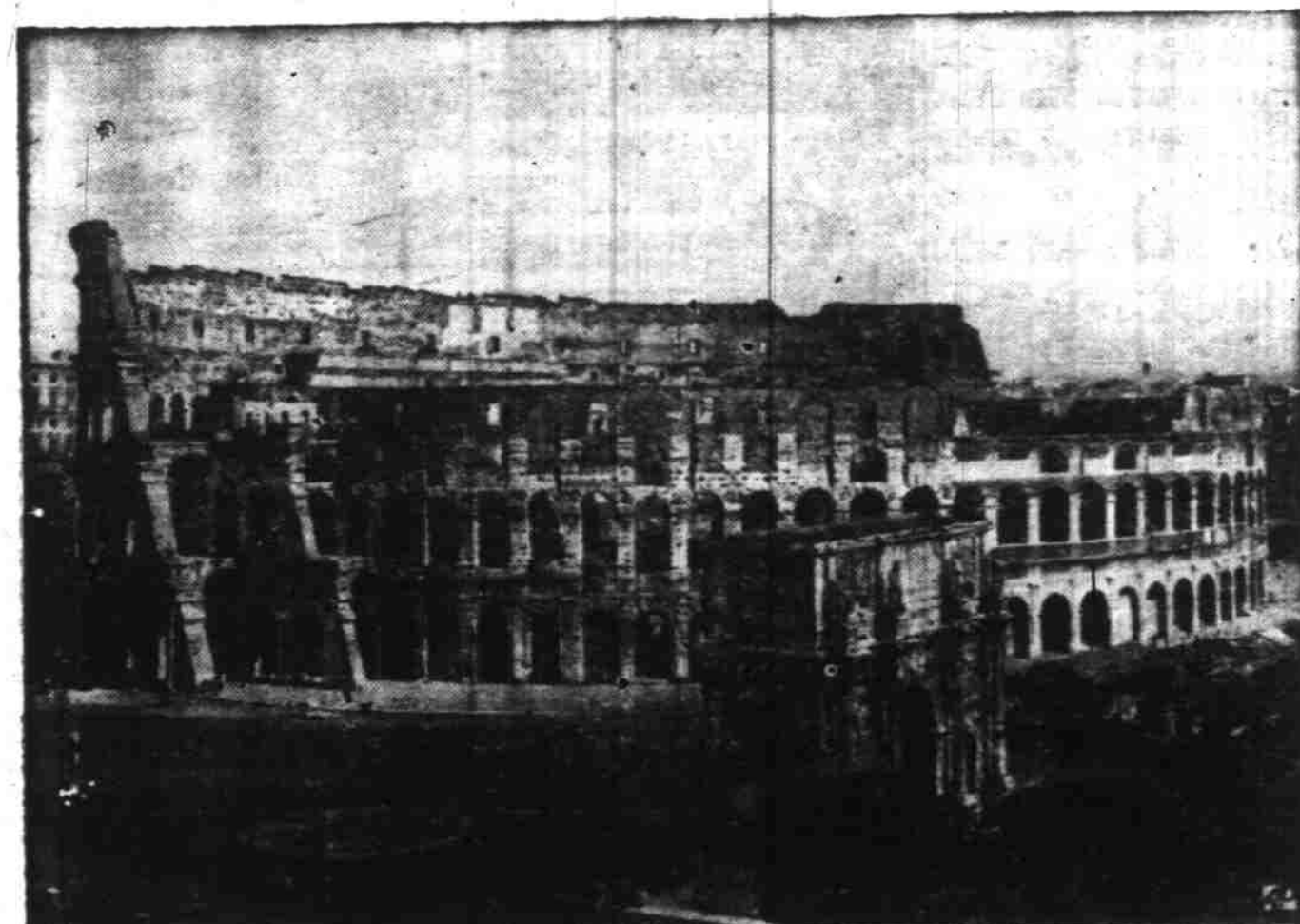
