NEW YORK, Jan. 6—The name of actress June Millarde (above), known also as Toni Seven, was linked romantically today with that of Senator Warren Magnuson (D-Wash.), who has been listed "necessarily absent" from the first sessions of the 81st congress. British Claim Israel Holds Egypt Area

LONDON, Jan. 6—(AP)—Israeli troops have established a fortified strongpoint five miles inside Egypt, a British foreign office spokesman charged tonight. The obvious deduction, the informant added, is that "The Jews intend to stay inside Egyptian territory."
(The acting U. N. mediator, Dr. Ralph Bunche, announced at Lake Success that Egypt has agreed for the first time to direct negotiations with Israel for an armistice in Palestine. In Tel Aviv, an Israeli army spokesman said the Jewish state has agreed to an immediate cease-fire.)

(Bunche set the cease-fire deadline for noon GMT, (7 a. m. EST) tomorrow. He previously had made the deadline 2 p. m. GMT. (9 a. m. EST) today, but said the time had to be put ahead because of "unfortunate communications delays.")

U.N. Still Fighting
(Dispatches from Tel Aviv had said the first deadline passed with fighting still going on, but that it was expected the order would be heeded momentarily.)

Egypt Position Worse
Accounts reaching London and Tel Aviv made it clear that Egypt's military position has grown. The two main routes from Cairo to Palestine now are said to be cut by Jewish forces.

The interception of the Egyptian troop train indicated the coastal route from Cairo to the southern Palestine coastal city of Gaza has been cut. A highway which parallels the railway through the sand dunes also is said to be within range of Israeli artillery.

The second route -- the old desert trail to BeerSheva -- is the one the British foreign office spokesman said Israeli troops had blocked with their strongpoint inside Egypt.

State Liquor Inventory Cut During Year

PORTLAND, Jan. 6—(AP)—State liquor administrator William Hammond reported today that liquor stocks had been reduced by \$3,875,987 during the year ending last month.

"The commission is getting its inventory down to a workable turnover," commented Commissioner Dr. Orval Eaton, Astoria.

Hammond said slow-moving items were cut in price, and bulk stocks were converted into bottled liquor, in an attempt to lower inventories.

The commission took its first disciplinary action under the regulation licensing bartenders and waitresses. It suspended the permits of two Astoria bartenders on a charge of sale of beer to an intoxicated person.

It was the last meeting for this commission. Chairman Eaton, Harry D. Bolvin, Klamath Falls, and Vice Admiral Thomas L. Gatch, U.S.N. retired, Portland, have all submitted their resignations to Gov.-elect Douglas McKay.

McKay said he has selected a democrat to replace democrat Bolvin, but did not disclose the name. Gatch was expected to refuse to continue because of the press of his law practice. There was believed a possibility that Eaton might remain.

The meeting also marked the end of a moratorium on new dispensing licenses. The ban had existed since September 1. The commission indicated new applications would be viewed on merits and in light of a recent survey and demand and enforcement facilities.

Local Couple Overcome by Gas Fumes

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Alley, 530 Salem Heights ave., were overcome by gas from a faulty vent on a floor furnace early Thursday morning. The four Alley children -- Lytle, Delilia, Douglas and Marjorie -- were taken ill from the fumes.

Mrs. Alley said she became ill when she arose about 6 a.m. Her husband was sick, and the children became ill when they were awakened. Youngest of the children, Marjorie, fainted. Mrs. Alley said she sent the children on to school because the heat was shut off.

Later Alley became worse. The first aid ambulance was called and aid men administered oxygen. Mrs. Alley was later overcome by the fumes and given first aid treatment. The couple remained under the care of physicians, but headaches were the only apparent effects Thursday night.

World's First 'Atomic Clock' Demonstrated

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6—(AP)—The world's first "atomic clock" said to show promise of giving man much more accurate time readings was demonstrated today.

The clock has been operated with such accuracy it loses or gains only a little more than a second a year, its developers said. This "approaches" the accuracy of clocks whose standard is the daily rotation of the earth -- the present standard of the world's time.

But scientists of the national bureau of standards said developments are in progress pointing to an accuracy several times as precise as that furnished by the turning earth.

The "clock" part of the new device is only slightly larger than a regulation size office clock -- but the cabinet-like mechanism that goes with it would preclude its use as a household piece, even if you wanted one.

And don't let that word "atomic" lead you to think this is a clock operated by atomic energy. Atomic motion or vibration is involved in the principle of the clock.

It's the vibration, back and forth, of the atoms which make up a given molecule of ammonia gas.

Sen. Magnuson Missing; Adds Fuel to Tale of Secret Wedding

SEATTLE, Jan. 6—(AP)—Sen. Warren A. Magnuson wasn't in the senate yesterday. He wasn't in Seattle. He couldn't be found in California, which he said he was going via on his way back east.

All this secrecy fanned the flames of reports that Film Actress Toni Seven was the senator's major interest at present. Magnuson and the 23-year-old golden haired actress appeared together here, socially several times during the senator's recent visit to Seattle.

His closest friends, however, denied any knowledge of a serious romance between the two.

The senator, married while in law school, was divorced in Seattle in 1929. Not long ago he was mentioned as one of the 10 most eligible bachelors in America.

Miss Seven in real life is June Millarde, daughter of Director Harry Millarde and Actress June Caprice. She met the senator in Washington, D. C., last spring.

Czechoslovak 'Free Market' Goods Costly

PRAGUE, Jan. 6—(AP)—Czechoslovaks got their first look at the high prices in the government's "free market" stores which opened today.

You could get a necktie for \$12. Children's overcoats would set you back \$58. Women's skirts were \$78 and underpants \$20. Prices were up 50 to 450 per cent over last week. On the "free market" you don't need ration coupons. But the government announced ration goods are subject to a big increased tax, too.

Premier Antonin Zapolocky explained at a news conference that the country's high priced "free markets" are intended to be only temporary and are aimed at wiping out the black market.

CHINESE HOMELESS SHANGHAI, Friday, Jan. 7—(AP)—More than 2,000 Chinese were made homeless today when fire destroyed about 800 bamboo shacks in Shanghai's Chapei district. There was no estimate of the number of casualties.

Formosa Isle Being Readied As Stronghold

NANKING, Friday, Jan. 7—(AP)—The official Chinese central news agency reported today that the big island of Formosa is being turned into a stronghold against the Chinese communists.

The agency reported an interview with Chen Cheng, new governor of Formosa, in which he was quoted as saying:

(1) There is little hope for peaceful settlement of China's civil war because "the communist party is not sincerely desirous of peace."

(2) That Formosa is being built into a "stronghold for the regeneration of the people," and that "neither communist forces nor communist thought will be allowed to infiltrate into Taiwan (Formosa), which is separated from the mainland by the sea."

(AP Correspondent James D. White reported from Formosa last week that hundreds of rich Chinese refugees and government officials are coming to the island by every steamer and plane.)

The news agency said Chen Cheng made his remarks at Taipei, Formosa, upon assuming the governorship of the island formerly controlled by government armies in Manchuria. Later he was China's chief of staff, resigning because of illness.

Dallas Mayor Offers Parking Meter Plan

DALLAS, Jan. 6—(Special) Parking meters for Dallas loomed as a possibility this week, following Mayor Hollis Smith's recommendation of their consideration to the city council at its first meeting of 1949.

Mayor Smith also spoke favorably of a city manager plan for Dallas in his annual message to the council. He said a new bond issue for the sewage disposal plant must be submitted to the people.

The bid of Dallas City bank on the 1948 street and sewer bonds was approved. The bid, \$100.11 per \$100 par value of bonds with interest at 2 1/2 per cent, was lowest of four submitted.

Two new members, Dr. Tom Starbuck and Dr. William A. Ott, were seated. The council elected Walter Craven to replace Abe Regier who declared himself unable to serve following his election in November.

PORTLAND, Jan. 6—(AP)—The republicans of this county agreed with the democrats today on one issue: that candidates should be checked for acceptability before receiving the party nomination.

The Multnomah county GOP committee executive board voted today to cooperate with democratic leaders in proposing changes in election laws.

Democrats of this county had complained earlier that the present system -- whereby any registered member of a party may enter the primary and, if he wins the most vote, receive the nomination -- enables the nomination of persons who may not be acceptable to the party.
