The Waverly club will hold its second formal dinner dance of the season on Saturday, January 29 at the Marion hotel.

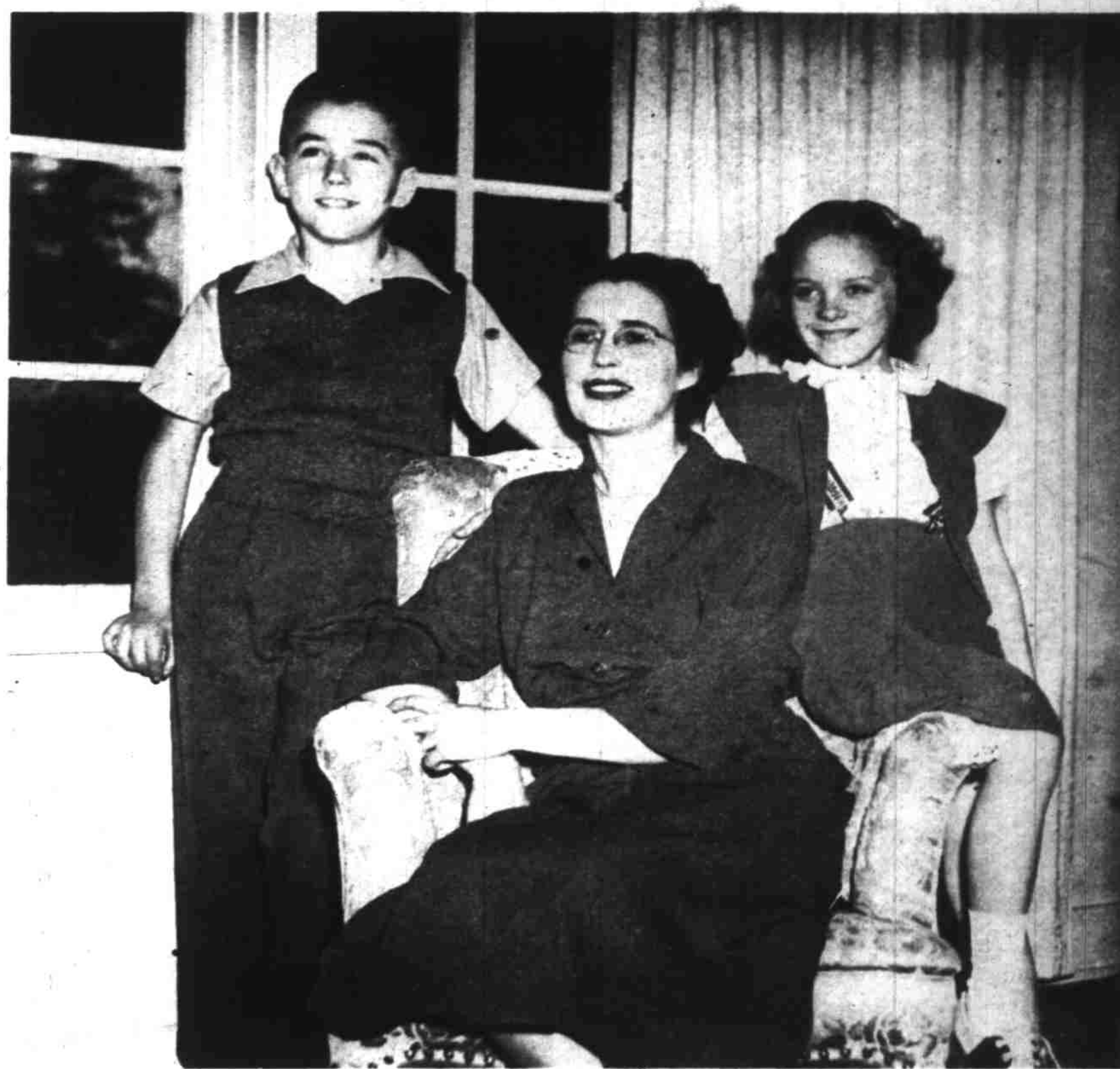
