Your Health

Not so long ago a number of people on the south side of Chicago became ill with a condition that puzzled their doctors for a while. It looked and acted like a typical pneumonia. At the time, it was recalled that some years ago an epidemic of a disease like influenza was first reported among Australian slaughterhouse workers in Queensland. Both of these diseases turned out to be Q fever. And now the organism which causes this disease has been identified and it called the Rickettsia burnetii. It seems probable that the disease is contracted from cattle in many cases, but just what way it is transmitted to human beings is not yet definitely known.

The symptoms of this condition include fever, headache, aching in the muscles, chills and, usually, symptoms of pneumonia. Such symptoms as sneezing, blocking of the nose, and sore throat are not outstanding. Usually there is a cough, which is dry. Later on in the disorder there may be physical findings of disturbances in the lungs. Often, the spleen in the left, upper part of the abdomen and the lymph glands throughout the body are enlarged. Fever may be as high as 102° and may last for from 5 to 14 days.

X-ray examination of the chest is helpful in the diagnosis. The X-ray examination helps to distinguish Q fever from another disorder known as virus pneumonia.

A definite diagnosis of Q fever can be made by finding the Rickettsia burnetii in the blood, or by finding an increase in the antibodies against the Q fever organisms.

Blood Test

It is not recommended that efforts be made to isolate the Rickettsia burnetii organism, except in a well regulated laboratory, because those working with it seem to easily contract the disease. Hence, the best method of diagnosis is to test the blood for the presence of the antibodies.

Q fever is rarely a fatal condition and, in the majority of instances, recovery occurs without complications.

Persons should be aware of the occurrence of this disorder so that if symptoms which suggest it develop, the proper tests may be carried out for making an accurate diagnosis.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: Can you tell me if there is a cure for prostate gland disorder?

A: Answer: Most prostate gland disorder can be alleviated, depending upon the type of condition present. Operation is necessary in some cases.

A genito-urinary specialist should be consulted for examination and proper treatment.
