### About a Book

"Trail Led North" Enjoying Deserved Popularity; Author Is Oregonian

There's something rather nice about knowing an author, though I suppose it's quite a common thing in some circles.

Two authors emerge from among the hundreds of friends and classmates of my college days.

The first has written several best sellers, the sort of ultra-sophisticated books that you avidly read and promptly forget. They are the sort of books that will go unsold at next year's rummage sale.

The second writer of my acquaintance is Martha Ferguson McKeown, "The Trail Led North," a book one reads and buys copies of for friends. It's a book, from which you learn to know the hero well. Martha McKeown's book is about a real person, her Uncle Mont Hawthorne, a hundred thousand words of his adventures in early day Astoria, up north with fish canneries and later as a seeker after gold in the Yukon. Because Uncle Mont tells the story himself, one feels very much acquainted with him. He's resourceful, hard working and has a kindly humor which endears him very much to the reader. Much has been written by reviewers in praise of "The Trail Led North," somehow it is a book that appeals to even those formerly disinterested in pioneers and the conquest of the northwest.

I'm very much inclined to go along with Uncle Mont when he said, after he'd read the book, "Martha, it's wrote good."

Mrs. McKeown, herself a third generation Oregonian (her grandparents were charter members of Salem's First Methodist church) is a graduate of Willamette university, so Salem may lay double claim to being her home town by adoption.

Mrs. McKeown talked about her

book at the Salem Women's club on Tuesday and later a dinner was given for her and her husband, Archie McKeown, Hood River orchardist, who acts as her driver and companion on the many auto-graphing and speaking trips scheduled by the publishers for the author of a popular book.

The author said that "The Trail Led North" is being translated into Swedish, but expressed wonder at just how Uncle Mont's quaint vernacular will sound in the Scandinavian tongue.

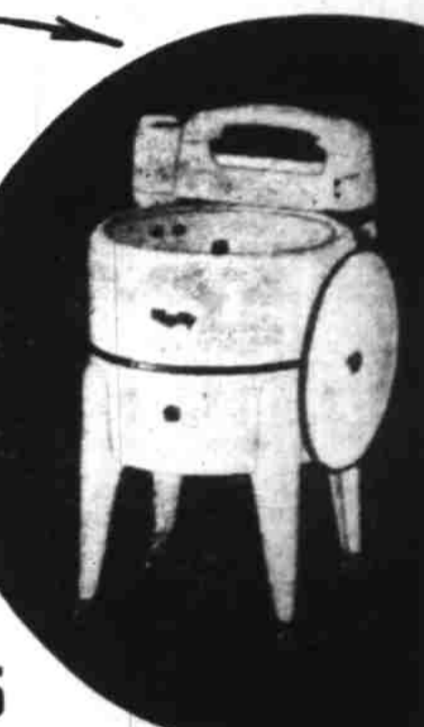
