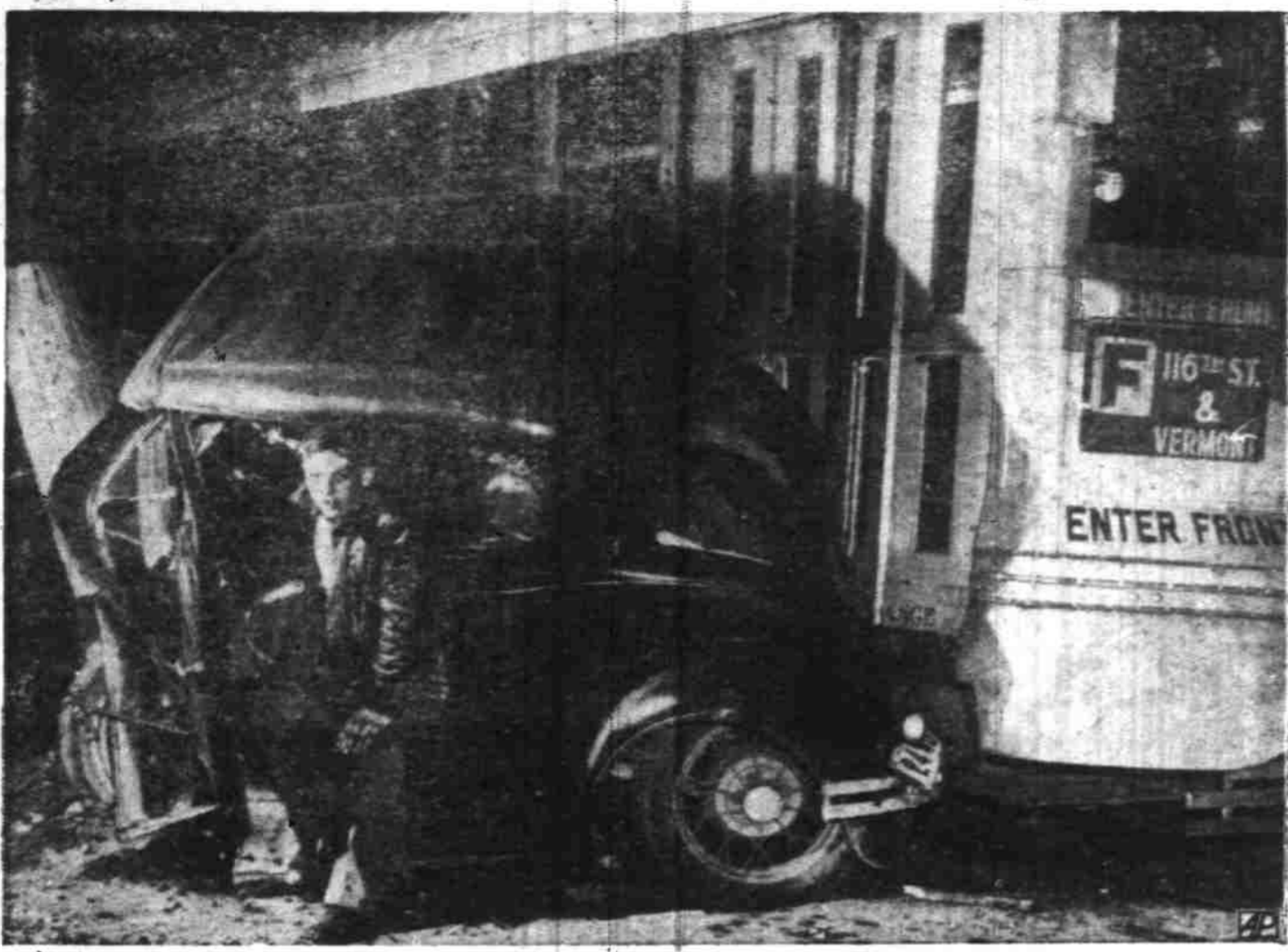


Auto Crushed, But Driver Escapes

Four Corners Firemen Limit Extent of Calls

FOUR CORNERS—Directors of the Four Corners Rural Fire Protection district have announced it will be impossible under existing conditions to answer fire calls outside of the designated fire district, except to those persons or group of persons adjacent to the district having contracted or made other provisions with the fire department for fire protection.

The designated boundaries are as follows: The west line is mill creek, then follows the Salem city line to a point 650 ft. north of Sunnyview ave., then follows that section line to about one and one half miles east of Swegle school then south to Center st., then east to a point in line with the Fruitland school, then south to include the Salem sanitary fill. Boundaries west from the Sanitary fill site one half mile then follows the Rickey school district boundaries north, excluding all of the Rickey school district except the Four Corners residential area.

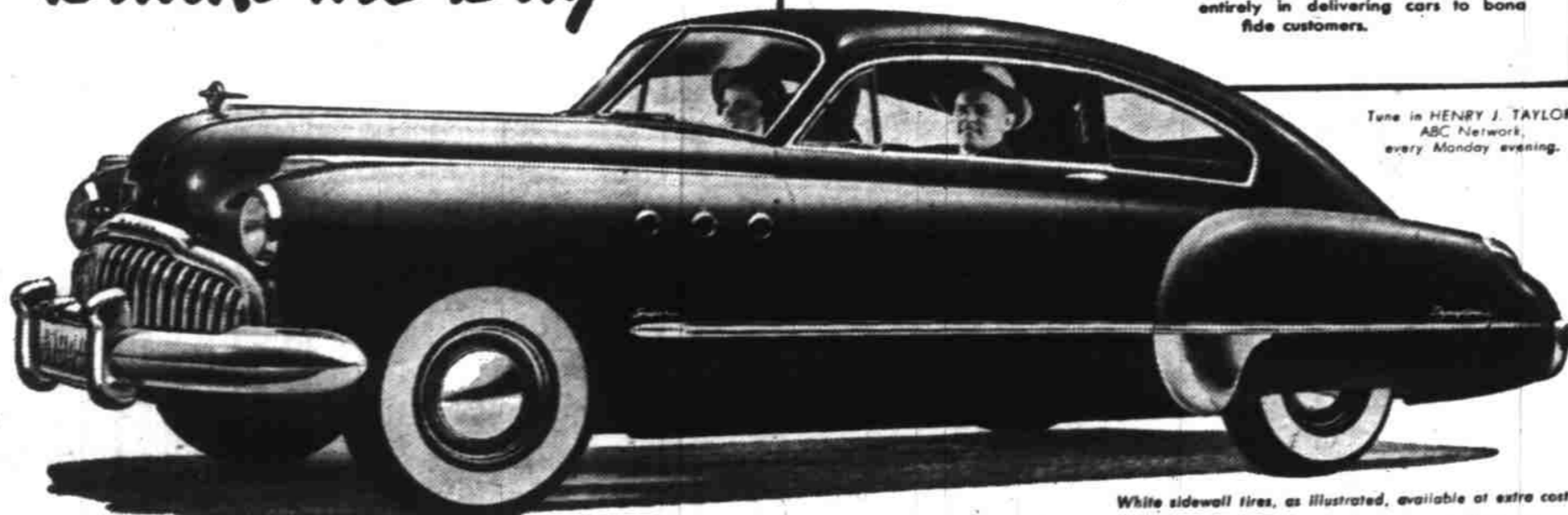
