### Half Fires in Rural Area, Stayton Reports Indicate

STAYTON — Annual report for Stayton Fire department compiled by Edward J. Bell, secretary, shows 30 calls made in 1948, 16 of them rural and 14 city calls.

Value of property comprising the rural calls was \$93,000 and an average of nine firemen attended all calls. Approximate loss in these calls was \$24,700 and the major loss was the Hitchman sawmill fire which was outside of the rural district.

Six of the rural fires were for grass or slashing fires, out of control; one catastrophic fire, one flue fire, and the balance were residential, barn and business buildings.

Value of property comprising the city calls was approximately \$36,500. An average of ten firemen attended city calls which included eight flue fires, one auto fire, one truck fire, two grass fires, and the balance business buildings.
