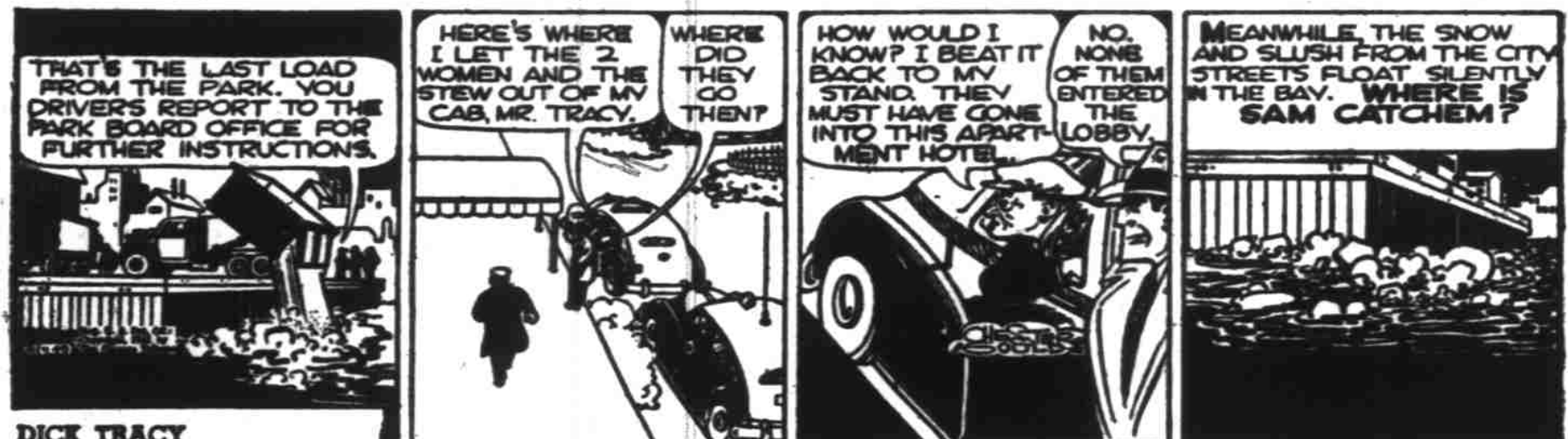

Recently a number of drugs have been discovered which are known as antihistamine agents. These preparations are useful in the treatment of allergic disorders, that is, conditions due to over-sensitivity to foods, drugs, or materials breathed in, such as pollens or dusts; and many people suffer from these over-sensitivities and do not know what is wrong with them.

In this oversensitivity called allergy, it is thought that the symptoms are due to the formation in the body of excessive amounts of a substance known as histamine, which is normally present in the body in small amounts. The antihistamine preparations can rid the body of excessive histamine.

Particular Advantage

One such preparation is known as neohistamine. The particular advantage of this preparation, according to Dr. Bundesen, is that it seems to be that reactions to its use occur less frequently than with other similar preparations.

The drug is given by mouth. These physicians administered it to a total of 249 patients. Relief of symptoms obtained from one dose of the drug lasted from one to six hours. Reactions to the preparation occurred in about one out of ten cases and consisted of such things as nervousness, sickness at the stomach and vomiting, sleeplessness and drowsiness.

The preparation seems to be particularly valuable in the treatment of hay fever. Only about one out of seven of 124 patients treated obtained no relief from this preparation. Of the patients with year-long hay fever, only one out of five had no benefit from the drug.

About four out of ten of the patients with asthma responded favorably to the drug. Patients with hives and skin inflammation, due to contact with substances to which they were sensitive, were benefited, but not to any great extent.

Number of Patients

Three out of six patients with migraine headaches also obtained relief. However, the number of patients treated was too small to permit any accurate conclusions as to the value of the drug in this condition at this time.

Of course, all of these antihistamine preparations should be employed only under the direction of a physician. In any case of allergy, the doctor will decide upon the exact treatment to be employed, and, if the antihistamine drugs should be used, he will prescribe the one which will be most beneficial.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

C. M. R.: Is an operation to remove the uterus always necessary when it has dropped?

Answer: Removal of uterus is not necessary when there is malposition of the uterus. An operation can be performed to correct the position.
