F. J. Craven, Dallas Bank Official, Dies

DALLAS, Feb. 3.—F. J. Craven, 70, executive vice president of the Dallas City bank, died Wednesday night in a Portland hospital. Funeral services will be held at the Methodist church Saturday at 2 p. m. with interment at Belcrest Memorial park in Salem.

Craven had been seriously ill since December 8 when he suffered a heart attack. A director of the local bank since 1909, Craven was a long-time member of the Dallas water commission and a former councilman.

He was born Dec. 2, 1878 at Millville, Mo., and came to Oregon with his parents in 1889. They settled first at Independence and moved here three years later. He operated a general store at Ballston with two brothers before taking a position with the bank in 1903. He became cashier in 1913 and executive vice president in 1941.

He was a member of the Masonic lodge at Sheridan, Marmon lodge, Knights of Pythias, and the Kiwanis club.

Survivors are his widow, Clarence, a son, Walter, and three grandchildren, all of Dallas, and a brother, E. H. Craven of Los Angeles.

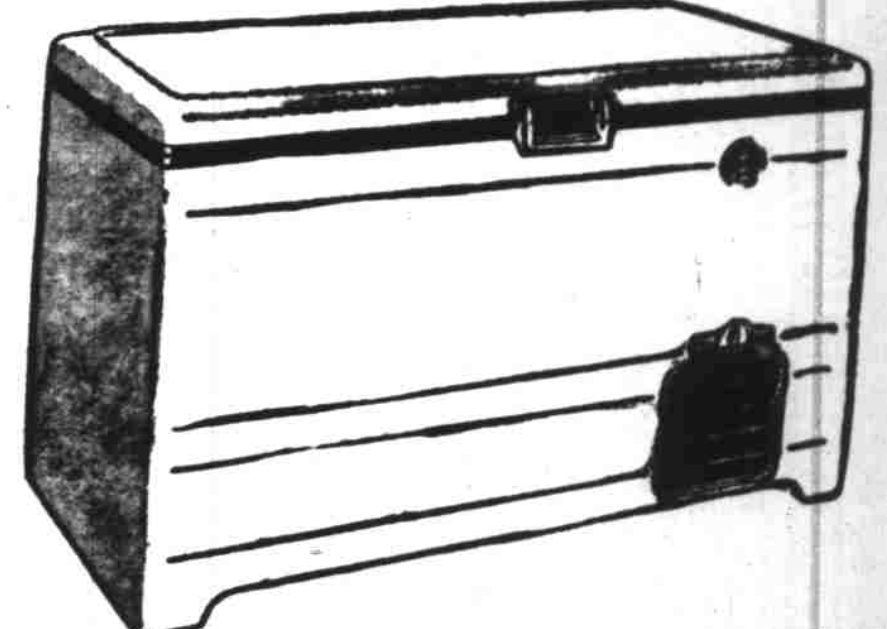

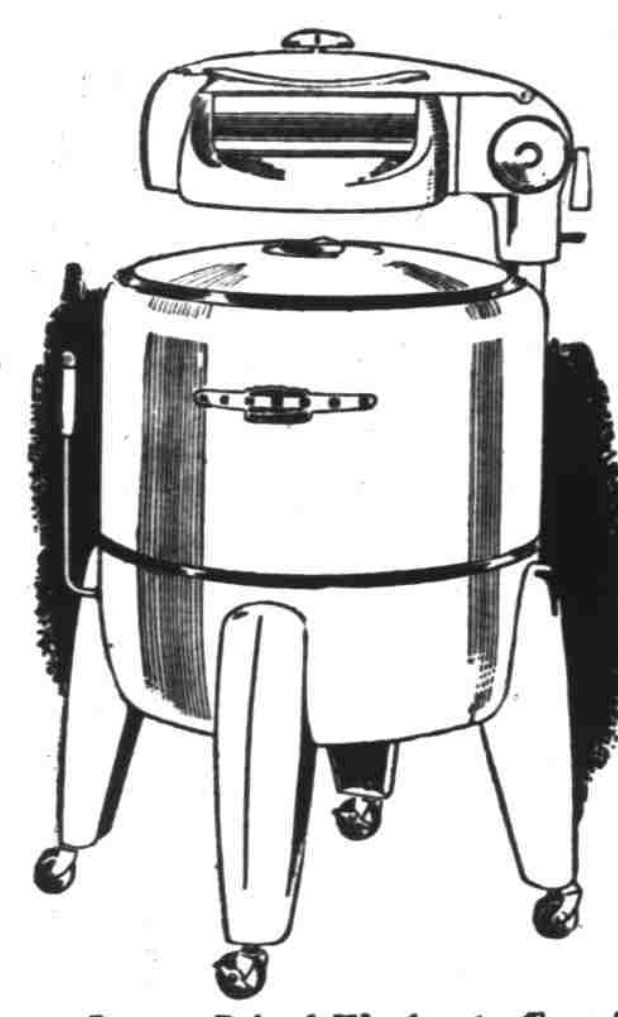

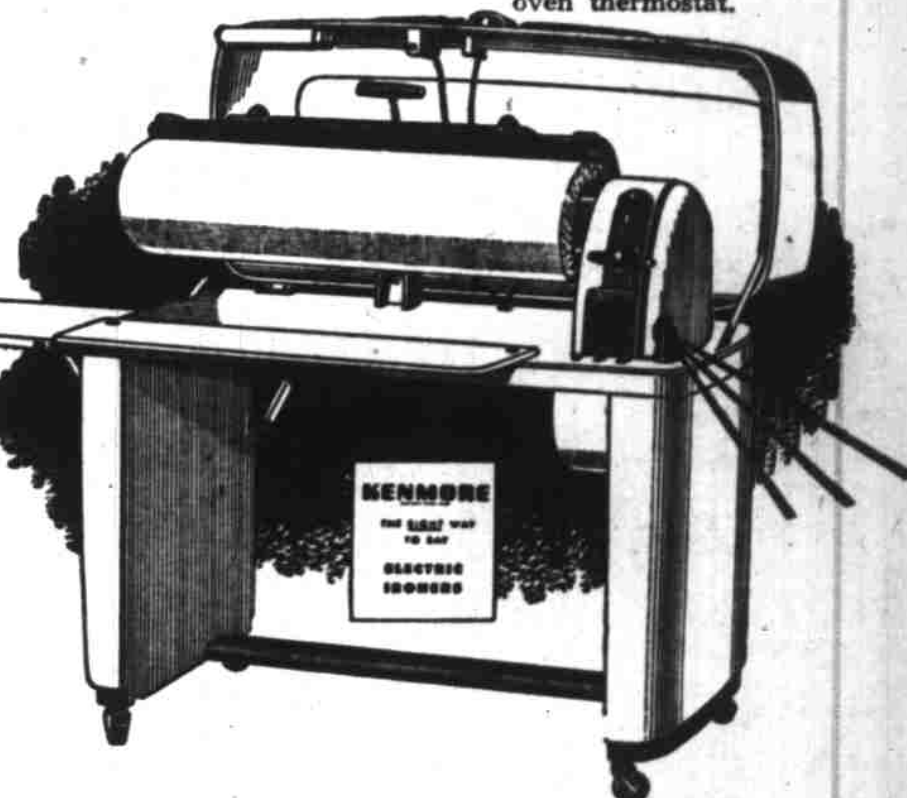
