Farmers' Oil Company Notes Business Rise

MT. ANGEL, Feb. 9 — Annual membership meeting of the Marion County Farmers Union Oil Co. at St. Mary's auditorium Monday disclosed the fact that the organization can boast an increase of 22.7 per cent in volume of business in the past year, representing over \$34,000.

The net margin of operation was in excess of \$56,000, to which will be added refunds from Pacific Supply Co., making a total net margin for the members for 1948 in excess of 15 per cent.

During the year 192 new members were taken into the organization for a total membership of 1,510.

The usual cash dividends have been declared.

Charles Baker, general manager of Pacific Supply Co., was the

principal speaker, outlining the plans of getting into crude oil and fertilizer production. Baker stated leases had already been made in California and that drilling is expected to start in the near future. The fertilizer plant will likewise be built soon. Enough stock has already been sold to finance the project.

About 250 members were served at the dinner in St. Mary's dining hall.

Ernest Werner, Warren Gray and Peter Kirk were re-elected to the board of directors.

At the organization meeting that followed, Werner was chosen president, Gray, vice president, and Peter Gores, secretary-manager. Gores has been manager of the Farmers Union Oil Co. for all of the 16 years it has been in operation.
