Top Egg Quality Rules Are Given

Three main factors govern the production of high quality eggs, says Noel Bennion, extension poultryman, Oregon State College. They are breeding, feeding and care of the eggs after they are laid. Quality of eggs goes down rapidly if they are not properly cared for. They should be gathered as shortly after laying as possible. Have regular gathering hours three or four times a day. Keep the nests as clean as possible and carefully clean the eggs that need it immediately after gathering.

Make Cions Now And Refrigerate For Later Use

The refrigerator vegetable compartment will provide good storage for small quantities of grafting wood during the next few weeks, according to Marion county extension agent D. L. Rasmussen. He suggests that the wood be cut now and stored until the grafts are made.

For apples, pears and prunes, the best grafting or cion wood is one year old and about the diameter of a lead pencil. It is usually cut from the outside and upper portion of the tree where there has been healthy growth last year. Terminal growth from 12 to 30 inches long is desirable for best cions. Since the middle portion is usually used for grafting, it is all right to cut off the butt and the ends before placing in the refrigerator, Rasmussen says.

The cion wood is labeled and bundled and wrapped in several thicknesses of kitchen-type paper
