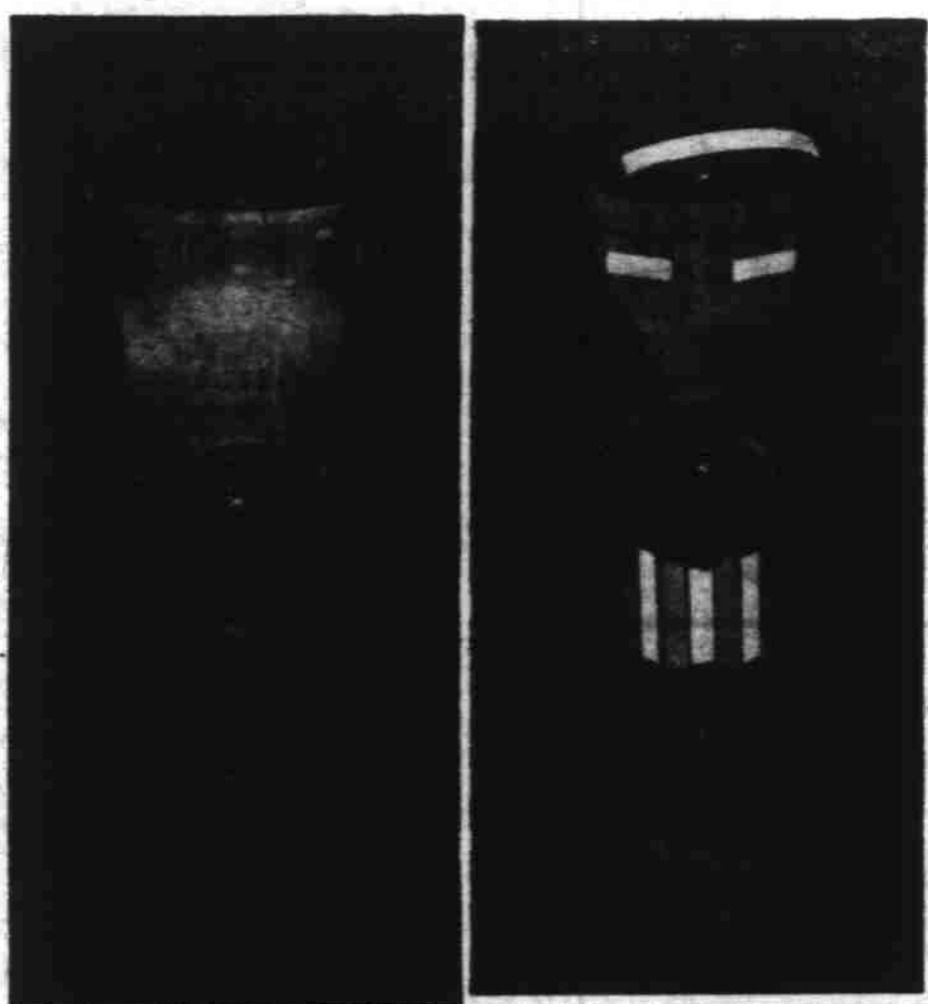


Fireplugs to Get 'New Look'



Salem will be the first city in the country to have fire hydrants that will glow in the glare of headlights. "Scotch-light" tape, which reflects light to a high degree, will be furnished the Salem fire department by the Salem Lions club for marking hydrants as part of its civic and safety project. Lions Provide 'Night-Lights' For Fireplugs

Sponsorship of expanded night-marking facilities, the annual registered dog show, a concert by the Eugene Gleemen and the annual Boy Scout circus gives Salem Lions club four major projects in the next two months. It was announced by President L. J. Stewart at the Lions luncheon in the Marion hotel Thursday noon.

Chairman Stanley Smith announced that marking of bicycles with "Scotch-light" tape which reflects light at night is a growing project which has just been expanded to include, on experimental basis, the marking of city fire hydrants.

He said the Salem fire department is apparently the first in this country to so mark hydrants for greater convenience in locating hydrants and for greater safety to the public.

The annual dog show, with 300 dogs expected, will take place April 2 and 3 at the fairgrounds, according to Chairman J. H. Willett. He said a new feature this year will be hourly public exhibitions of trained dogs with their juvenile masters at public places preceding the opening of the show Saturday.

The Salem Lions club is co-operating with Hollywood Lions and Englewood PTA in sponsoring a concert by the Eugene Gleemen on April 22. The scout circus will take place later.

At the luncheon meeting yesterday the club heard a talk by Don Madison, Salem resident who described his recent trip to Europe.
