Thief Loots Middle Grove School Kitchen

Nearly \$38 worth of food was taken from the kitchen of Middle Grove school Wednesday night, according to Deputy Sheriff William DeVall, who investigated the entry Thursday.

Entry into the school was gained through a north window - apparently left unlocked. The entire building, including desks and the principal's office, was ransacked but nothing was taken except food from the pantry and ice box in the kitchen.

Missing, DeVall said, are cans of corned beef, turkey, honey, beans, a case of cheese, three pounds of butter and three pounds of fresh meat. The food is used in the school's student noon lunch program. Middle Grove school is about three miles northeast of Salem on the Salem-Silverton road.
