

Drive to Block Wallgren Costs Cain \$1,000

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26 (AP)—The fight by Senator Cain (R-Wash) to prevent confirmation of former Governor Wallgren of Washington to a \$14,000-a-year administration post is going to cost the senator personally a lot of money.

Cain is opposing the nomination of Wallgren to be chairman of the National Securities Resources board.

In carrying on his fight over the last three weeks Cain has been in almost constant communication by telephone and telegraph with persons in his home state, has had photographs and photostats of documents made and has gone to other expense to gather material he needed to support his contention before the senate armed services committee.

Cain told a reporter today that telephone and telegraph charges alone will amount to more than \$500 and that other expenses will bring the total cost of his fight against Wallgren to more than \$1,000.

In answer to a question, the senator said his office fund will take care of some of the expense and "that I will pick up the rest of it," personally.

"I told my staff to disregard cost," Cain said, "and to get me the material we needed."

Cain spent the weekend preparing his final statement for the committee, which, chairman Tydings (D-Md) said, may decide by next Thursday whether to approve Wallgren's nomination.

Willamette U. Speakers Win Sweepstakes

Willamette University's speech team won the sweepstakes award at the Linfield 19th annual invitational speech tournament this week end over 29 other western colleges.

The Willamette orators garnered five firsts, five seconds and two thirds to top second ranking Gonzaga by 13 1/2 points. 148 debate teams from 30 colleges participated in the three-day tourney.

Winning first for the Willamette team were Betty Ferguson and Joan Morgan in women's debate; Robert Sayre and Tom Bartlett in men's debate; Jack Gunn and Elliott Molschenbacher, also men's debate; Tom Bartlett in extemporaneous speaking (junior division); and Jack Gunn, experimental speaking.

Second place awards went to Jack Gunn in extemporaneous speaking; Joan Morgan, senior division women's extemporaneous speaking; Frank Lockman, junior division men's oratory; Robert Sayre, senior division extemporaneous and Betty Ferguson, experimental speaking. Frank Lockman placed third in extemporaneous and Tom Bartlett third in junior division men's oratory.

All first place winners were awarded cups and Willamette was awarded a large trophy for winning the sweepstakes.

Man Victim of 50-Foot Wave

SAN LUIS OBISPO, Calif., Feb. 26 (AP)—A 50-foot-high wave swept three people off a breakwater at Morro bay today. One was missing and believed drowned.

Picked up by the giant wave were John Peck and his wife, Dolores, both of Morro bay, and William A. Lewis, Ann Arbor, Mich. Peck and his wife swam back toward the breakwater and were rescued by onlookers. Lewis, unable to swim, was swept out of reach.

Morro bay is about 10 miles southwest of here and halfway between San Francisco and Los Angeles. Giant waves have been pounding at Redondo Beach, in the Los Angeles area, for several days.

Though it's to combat juvenile delinquency, adults are welcomed also.

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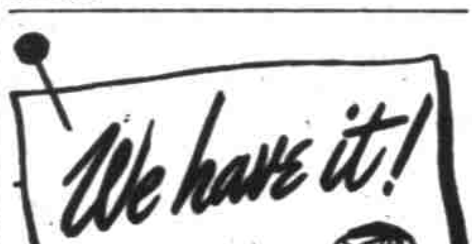
