Church Plans Made

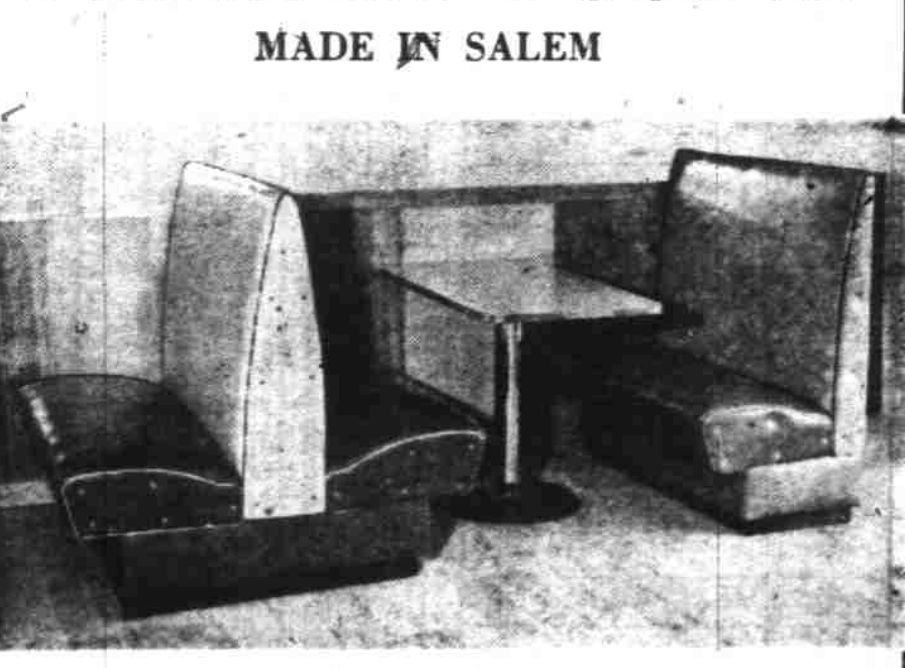
