

## Wheat Leads Decrease in Grain Market

CHICAGO, March 21 (AP)—Grains slid downward under the leadership of wheat today as the first full day of spring emphasized in traders' minds the relatively favorable crop outlook for the present year.

Wheat fell as much as 3 cents at one time, the May delivery leading the retreat. New crop contracts also backed down, all selling within 10 cents of the extreme low made in the February price

break. Corn and oats also lost ground, but deferred oats contracts held fairly steady.

Soybeans and lard joined the general downswing.

The commodity credit corporation twice lowered its bid for cash wheat, and in addition restricted ed. Only 453,000 bushels were any one source.

The inference of the agency's action was that it was getting off more wheat than it wanted. Only 453,000 bushels were bought at all offices last week-end.

Cash wheat receipts continued to run ahead of a year ago and visible supply figures showed an increase of 2,457,000 bushels over the past week. Last year the visible supply declined.

## Stock Market In Small Drop

NEW YORK, March 21 (AP)—The stock market declined today by fractions to around a point in a quiet session.

Early prices inclined higher. Final quotations were around the lowest point of the day.

The volume of trading was 620,000 shares, one of the slowest days this month.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks, which was unchanged at noon, fell .2 of a point at the close. Industrials were down .3 of a point. Rails were off .2 of a point and utilities declined .1 of a point.

## Jobs Open in Liquor Stores

Positions in Oregon state liquor stores are being opened to examination for the first time by the state civil service commission, it was announced last week.
