

Realtors Move Meeting Place

Salem Board of Realtors will hear a talk on the city's Hospital Development program Friday when the local realtors gather for luncheon at a new meeting place, the Cherry room in the basement of Hotel Senator.

Speaker this Friday noon will be E. T. Franklin, director of the \$1,100,000 campaign for hospital development here. The board has just changed its meeting place for regular Friday luncheons from the Marion hotel to the Senator.

Kelley, Farquhar Consolidates Cannery Work in Bigger Plant

Consolidation of food processing operations of Kelley, Farquhar and Company at 1460 Tile rd., was announced Wednesday in connection with the firm's lease of an additional 52,000 square feet of floor space and other facilities from Keith Brown.

Moving of cherry pitting and brining equipment from the Front and Norway streets plant has already begun, in order to be prepared for this year's crop. The company has used one building at the Tile road site for several years in freezing of various fruits and vegetables.

Brown, who leased approximately one-half of his present plant to the food company, said

his lumber company manufacturing activities would be reduced and concentrated. Already underway is construction of a new office building and a storage structure. The Keith Brown entrance will now be from Madison street rather than Tile road. Brown said the firm would pursue the promotion of smaller items of merchandise.

The new one story office building will cost \$8,700 and is going up at 1965 7th st., according to a permit issued by the city building inspector's office to Brown and Asel Eoff.

Fred L. Halvarson, manager, said Kelly, Farquhar would retain its warehouse on Locust avenue for the present. Freezing operations will begin in late May with the advent of strawberries, followed closely by the work of cherry preservation. It is expected the plant will employ about 750 persons at the peak of the 1949 season.

Also revealed Wednesday was the sale of the Keith Brown residence at 1590 Fairmount st., to Mr. and Mrs. Howard Eismann. Eismann is manager of the Salem office of S. S. Steiner, Inc., hop dealers. The Browns will move to their farm home near Halls Ferry.

Bloodmobile Due at St. Paul

Next visitation of the bloodmobile from the Portland blood center to Marion county is booked for Thursday, April 7, at St. Paul. To date 128 donors are signed up in the St. Paul area. The bloodmobile will be at the fire house there, starting at 11 a. m. next Thursday. Mrs. Carl Smith is chairman for arrangements for the unit to visit at St. Paul.

Dr. Richard Stone, physician with the bloodmobile, and Susan M. Faherty, manager of Marion county chapter, American Red Cross, were at St. Paul this week to line up arrangements.

On April 12 the unit will come to Salem for its second visit here. Later, it is also planned to have the unit go to Mt. Angel. Any community which can provide the facilities and 100 or more donors is entitled to a visit of the bloodmobile, states Col. Philip W. Allison, chairman of the donor recruitment in the blood program here.

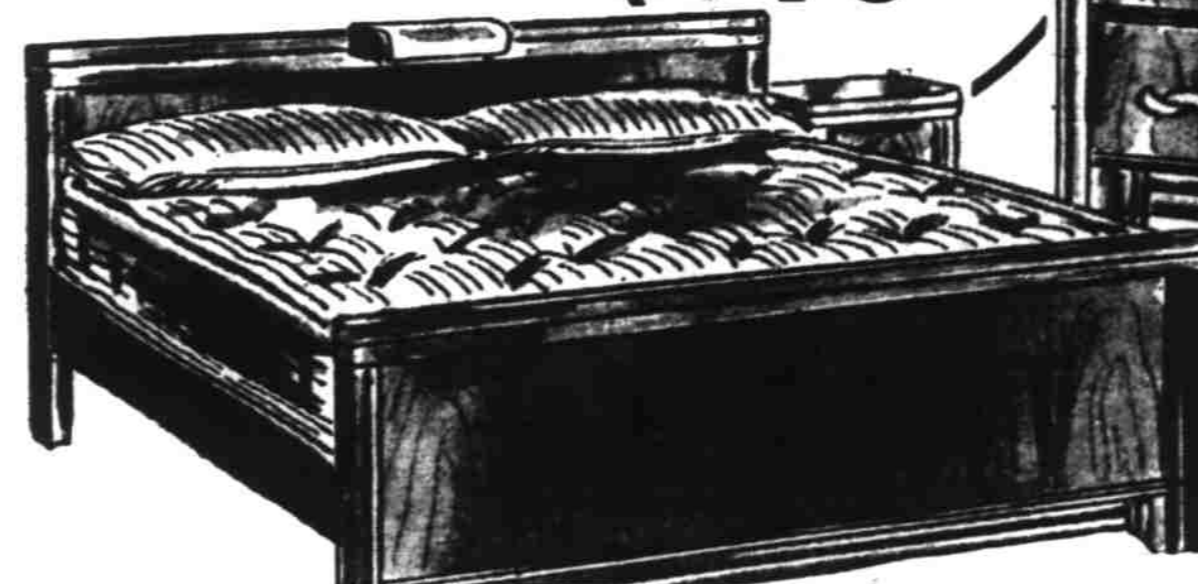
