

WASHINGTON, April 2 -(AP)-The United States and Britain teamed up today in a move toward bringing three Soviet bloc countries to international judgment for "notorious" flouting of their peace treaty vows.

They sent strongly worded notes to Hungary, Bulgaria and Romania demanding that these communistrun governments live up to pledges signed less than two years ago rights and freedoms.


