**West Charges Red Bloc with Pact-Busting**

WASHINGTON, April 2—(AP)—The United States and Britain teamed up today in a move toward bringing three Soviet bloc countries to international judgment for "notorious" flouting of their peace treaty vows.

They sent strongly worded notes to Hungary, Bulgaria and Romania demanding that these communist-run governments live up to pledges signed less than two years ago to give their peoples basic human rights and freedoms.

Canada, Australia and New Zealand also supported the action.

The notes took specific exception to Hungary's imprisonment of Cardinal Mindszenty, Bulgaria's prosecution of protestant churchmen and Romania's jailing of opposition leaders.
