

Bridge Program Opens in North End of County

New Bridges Installed in Marion County

Current installation of new marks the beginning of the county's 1949 bridge program, County Commissioner Roy Rice said Sat-

A new bridge is going in at the Dunagan crossing of Abiqua creek above Silverton. A steel span, formerly owned by the state, is being installed over Pudding river

At the Dunagan crossing the old wooden structure is being torn down and a new bridge will be built at the site. It is expected the new span will be completed by about June 1. It will be closed to traffic for the last 30 days of its construction, Rice said.

Rice described the Dunagan project as "an emergency measure" while the McKee replacement, he said, had been on the county's "regular bridge schedule." School districts in that region had complained of the weakness of the Dunagan bridge. It was stated that loaded school buses could not pass

The McKee bridge will be completed early this summer. It is to go up alongside the old one which will remain in use. The county also plans construc-
