Grains Move Ahead Briskly

CHICAGO, April 9—(AP)—Grains moved ahead briskly in the closing minutes on the board of trade today. May wheat setting the pace in a short-covering movement. Although wheat showed the most strength, other grains, soybeans and lard also firmed.

Wheat closed 3/4-1 1/4 higher, corn was 1/4-1/2 higher, oats were 1/4 lower to 1/2 higher, rye was 1 1/2-1 3/4 higher, soybeans were 1/2-3/4 higher and lard was 2 to 3 cents a hundred pounds higher.

Action of the CCC as a market influence would that grain shipments to New Orleans, both by rail and barge, had been embargoed. It was said the action was taken because of lack of vessel space at the southern port.
