In 1948, 162 Marion county children received 21,250 days of care from child-caring agencies assisted by funds from the Oregon Chest, L. A. Warner, president, has announced.

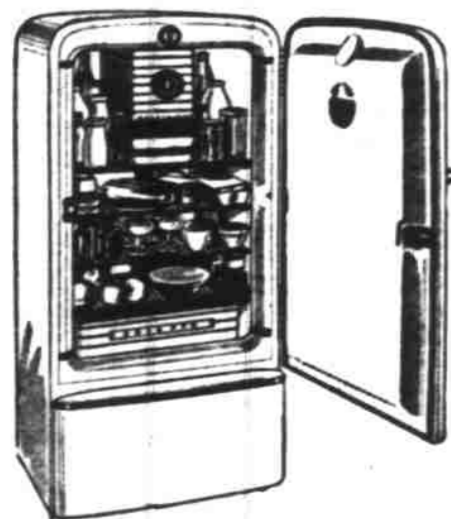
