

Ailing Heel Threatens DiMaggio's Career

Ailing Heel — 3-30-1949. — **PORT WORTH, April 12** — (P) Joe DiMaggio, \$100,000 — a year star of the New York Yankees, left for Baltimore by air today to have his injured right heel treated at Johns Hopkins hospital.

He will be lost to the club for the start of the season next week. But he denied any thought of retiring from baseball.

(At Dallas, where his plane stopped for five minutes, DiMaggio told a newsman "I certainly am not going to retire from baseball. There's a lot of folks that would like to see me retire. These sadistic people, you know." He

did not amplify the statement but apparently was quite nettled when asked if he planned to retire.)

A drastic turn of events came after the great centerfielder was given a four-hour examination by Dr. T. M. Girard, a Dallas specialist. Dr. Girard was recommended to the Yankees by Dr. George Bennett of Baltimore, the surgeon who operated on DiMaggio's heel last November.

"He will be there 10 days," Dr. Girard said, "taking X-rays and inoculations."

The specialist described the heel trouble as "hot condition."

Yankees' Porterfield Tosses No-No Contest

PORT WORTH, Tex., April 12 — (P) — Bob Porterfield, the New York Yankees' sophomore right-hander, pitched an eight-inning no-hit, no-run game today in humbling the Port Worth Cats of the Texas league, 10-0.

The game was called after eight innings to enable the Yankees to catch a train for Terre Haute, Ind., where they meet that city's Triple-A league entry tomorrow.

It was the first no-hit performance of the major leagues' spring training season. The last in no-hits was carved by Murry Dickson, then with the St. Louis Cardinals, who shut out the Yankees, 7-0, on March 30 last year.

Porterfield now has gone 15 1/2 innings without yielding a safety. One was down in the second inning when Hank Sauer got Cincinnati's only hit April 4.

Rocky Expects To Fight Again

NEW YORK, April 12 — (P) — Rocky Graziano, boxing's one-time "golden boy," expects to have his National Boxing Association suspension lifted shortly.

The former world's middle-weight champion, currently banned in New York as well as by the sprawling N.B.A., is working out at a New York gym in order to be ready for action soon. Several promoters are interested in signing Graziano as soon as he is cleared.

Rocky was barred by the N.B.A. after he ran out on a Dec. 1 match with Fred Apostoli in Oakland, Calif. New York, which is not an N.B.A. member, suspended the Brooklyn boxer Feb. 7, 1947, for failing to report a bribe offer on a fight which never came off.

Wheat Prices Bound Higher

CHICAGO, April 12 — (P) — Wheat bounded up on the board of trade today, closing at its high on gains of more than a cent. The strength of the bread cereal was not reflected in other sections of the market, where prices ended mixed.

A little while buying entered wheat, but most of the purchases came from traders who had gone short prior to issuance of the agriculture department's crop report late yesterday. When they bought back in today they found a scarcity of offerings.

Wheat closed 1 to 1 1/2 higher, corn was 1/4 lower to 1/2 higher, soybeans were 3/4 lower to 1/2 higher, rye was 1/4-1/2 higher, soybeans were unchanged to 1/4 lower and lard was 13 to 20 cents a hundred pounds lower.

May wheat led the advance in the bread cereal.
