

County Denies Plea for Jail In Detroit Area

Denial of permission for an auxiliary county jail at Detroit, in an opinion given Marion county court Thursday, drew from Sheriff Denver Young the declaration that the decision made expansion of his law enforcement personnel in the area even more essential.

The court was informed by Deputy District Attorney Sam B. Harbison that it could own or lease prison facilities only in the county seat, under state laws. The court has power to do only those acts specified or implied by law.

Asked by County Judge Grant Murphy, Harbison added that a jail could not be provided to serve

the Breitenbush justice of the peace district. This led the judge to assert that the district was thus made of doubtful value, as all minor offenders would have to be brought to jail here between appearances in the Breitenbush area court.

The request for canyon jail quarters came from both the sheriff and from 40 residents of the Detroit area, who submitted a petition to the court this week. Sheriff Young recently asked the court to provide additional deputies for the canyon area, one immediately, two more during the summer and another by the time dam building operations reach their peak in 1950. One deputy now patrols the area, commuting daily from Salem.

Judge Murphy said Thursday that more deputies can not be contemplated before beginning of the new fiscal year July 1.

Still to be considered by the city council, however, are Bean's proposals for a tax on non-residents who work in Portland, doubling of license fees, and additional levies on professions and businesses.

Letticken, Dallas; five brothers, Ray Yocum and George Yocum of Yandu, Jeff Yocum of Portland, Homer Yocum of Stockton, Calif. and Harry Yocum of Kuna, Idaho. Legality of Annexation Vote Upheld

Validity of Salem's annexation of 368 acres of Polk county territory was upheld Thursday by Circuit Judge Charles H. Combs.

The Lakeview judge who had heard the case for an injunction to prevent the annexation order with a memorandum opinion concluding that "it is my opinion that the proceedings for annexation of such territory was in all respects valid and that territory is now within the boundaries and a part of the city of Salem."

The injunction suit was brought by John Lutz against the city of Salem, stressing among other objections that annexation had excluded a 7-2 shaped area of several acres completely surrounded by the annexation area.

The Lutz complaint said that property owners within the excluded area were deprived of a vote on the annexation and their property now could be annexed by the city without an election, under a state law permitting such annexations in areas entirely within a city's boundaries.

Judge Combs' opinion, however, noted that only five families resided in the surrounded area and their votes could not have changed result of the election which favored annexation by vote of 181 to 75 in the area and 8,522 to 2,695 in the city. The judge added that although the law provides the city can annex the enclosed area with or without consent of owners, there was no evidence before the court that the city intends to annex this additional area. He noted also that the annexation law does not require any shape or form for areas to be annexed.

Clears Up Description

Answering the plaintiff's contention that the annexation territory had not been clearly described in election notices and ballots, Judge Combs said "It is my judgment that the legislative intent that the territory should be described by exterior boundaries and not by a general description or by some local name applied to the locality."
