Chrysler Stock Sale Highlights Stock Trading

NEW YORK, April 16-(AP)-Sale of a \$1,000,000 block of Chrysler stock for cash highlighted today's

The Chrysler transaction was one of the largest such deals since the end of the war.

The market generally began to rise after a wobbly start and final prices in many cases were the best of the day. Demand for oil issues, with gains of more than a point and some at top prices for the year, provided the power for the improvement.

The Chrysler sale consisted of 19.822 shares at 50 1/4, or a dollar total of \$996,055.50. The price represented an advance of 1/4 point over Thursday's close. Chrysler moved up rapidly later and finished 1% ahead at 51%.

Brokerage houses reported that the stock was sold by Canadian interest who feared the effect of an anticipated increase in the par value of Chrysler to \$25 a share from \$5. Stockholders will meet Rural School from \$5. Stockholders will meet Tuesday to decide the matter.
