Citation and Coaltown Named To Romp in California Race

INGLEWOOD, Calif., April 21-(AP)—Citation and his challenging stablemate, Coaltown, headed 87 nominations announced today for the \$100,000 Hollywood Gold Cup at Hollywood Park July 16.

Whether Warren will bring one or both of his thoroughbred stars to Hollywood park remains to be seen, but a track official said: "We have hopes."
