Among some of the drugs used for controlling the grand mal attacks are phenobarbital, dilatin sodium, and mesantoin. The preparations may be given alone or in combination. Of course, treatment with there drugs must be carried out under the direction of the physician who will decide upon the type of drug or drugs to be used and the exact dose. If the attacks occur often when the drugs
