



**Court Hearing** Set Here for **Prison Inmate** 

Marion County Circuit Judge George Duncan Monday ordered an inmate of Oregon state prison to be brought before him on May 9 for hearing on the prisoner's petition that he is being illegally confined.

A writ of habeas corpus issued by Judge Duncan orders George Alexander, prison warden, to produce Chauncey Guymon, the inmate, in court. Guymon alleges he is being denied credits for good behavior.

According to Guymon's petition he was sent to prison from Lane county Nov. 24, 1931, on a charge

released last January 1.

The petition alleges that Alexander has refused to release the prisoner because of "the alleged breach of parole" in 1941. Guymon says his conduct has been good while in prison and that he has "undergone a general reformation," and deserves to be released.


