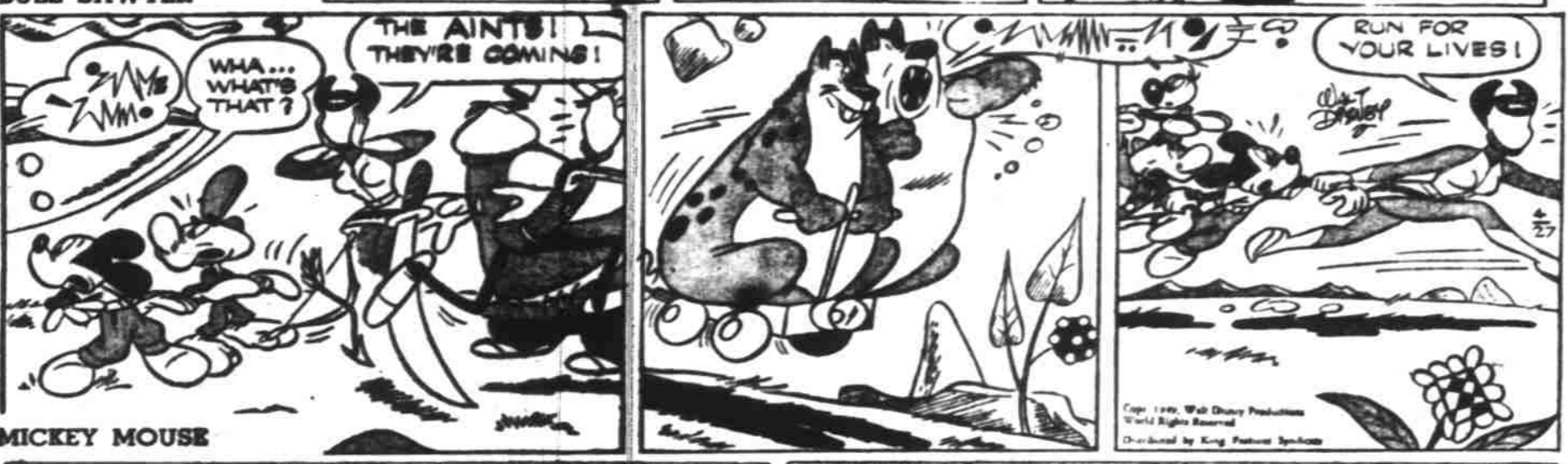
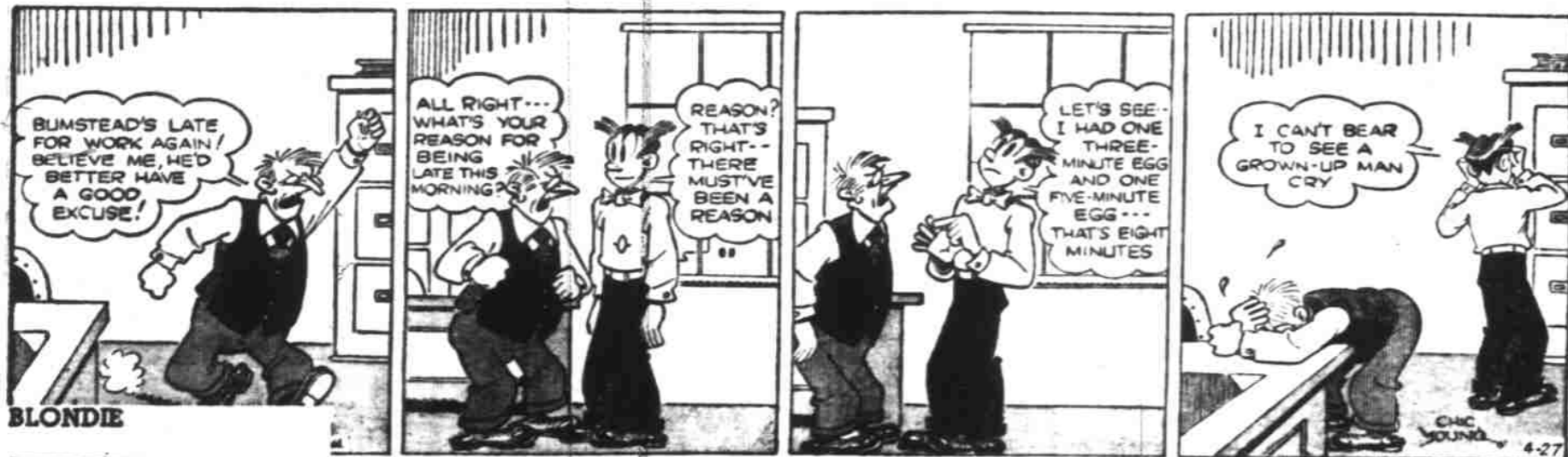

Persistent Hoarseness

So far, 96 separate diseases and conditions which cause hoarseness have been listed. This symptom may come as the aftermath of a cold, but, on the other hand, it may also be due to such serious conditions as brain tumor, tuberculosis, syphilis or swelling of the aorta, the large artery coming from the heart. For this reason, it never pays to neglect hoarseness. Whenever it lasts for more than two weeks, it demands a careful study to learn its cause.

Generally speaking, hoarseness usually comes as a result of voice strain, inflammation, or infectious conditions.

Public Speakers

Voice strain is not limited to singers, public speakers, and teachers. It may occur in persons who are constantly with deaf individuals or who must talk loudly to make the deaf hear them. Children and adolescents suffering from hoarseness may have misused their voices cheering their favorite team at some athletic event.

Acute inflammation of the larynx or voice-box leading to hoarseness is often accompanied by fever, rapid heart beat, and other signs of infection. It must be remembered that diphtheria is always a possible cause of hoarseness and, when the hoarseness is due to an acute infection, it is important to make sure that diphtheria is not present.

In carrying out the examination to determine the cause of the hoarseness, the patient's history must be scrutinized and his habits, such as use of tobacco and alcohol, taken into consideration. His occupation may be a factor, particularly if he works in a dusty or smoky place or comes in contact with industrial gases.

Physical Examination

The patient should have a complete physical examination, studies of the blood, and x-rays of the chest and nasal sinuses. The laryngoscope, an instrument made up of a tube with an light, should be used so that the doctor can look directly into the larynx. If necessary, a bit of the tissues of the larynx may be removed and examined under the microscope, particularly when there are signs of tumor growth, because in this way the exact type of tumor can be diagnosed. An early diagnosis of cancer of the larynx is thus possible.

Treatment of hoarseness will depend entirely upon its cause. The important thing is to find the cause and eliminate it.

In general, the patient's voice must be rested and any irritating factors eliminated, such as abuse of tobacco, alcohol, or working in surroundings where there is a great deal of dust or smoke. The breathing in of steam may be beneficial.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

J. D.: My child has had their tonsils removed, still they catch colds. What is the cause of this?

Answer: Removal of the tonsils does not prevent colds.

A person who has repeated colds should have a careful examination by a physician in order to make sure that there is no abnormal condition in the nose, throat, or sinuses which might be causing the frequent colds.

Hollywood On Parade

HOLLYWOOD—So you want to win the jackpot? Well, off with the washing machine, deep freeze, and the whole beef to put in it! Then don't!

Corner the master of eardrum-tick and him hard-luck story... Sit in the front row with your legs crossed and your eyes winking like a teardrop.

Make smart remarks to the emcee during the pre-buzz warm-up... Go from show to show until your face becomes as familiar to emcees as their warm-up gags.

On the other hand, if you want the headman to pick you as a contestant, laugh loudly and heartily at his warm-up jokes. Not in a trick laugh, however, like a high-pitched, nervous whiny or a shrill hiccup. The audience may laugh more at you than at the emcee. And a smart-looking red hat will catch his eye every time.

These tips to aspiring contestants are from Art Linkletter, who probably is radio's smoothest, most gig master of ceremonies. Art is big, blond, effusive, self-confident, and 36. He works 30 hours a week on two shows—"House Party" five days a week and "People Are Funny" Tuesday nights—and is paid \$4,500.

Art sees a change in radio contestants in the last three years. Some who get prizes are not satisfied with them.

A family was flown here to receive \$1,800 worth of prizes. The visitors were put up at a hotel and taken to night club. Art says the father cornered him and whispered, "I'll bet you guys have a big surprise for us, something really big." Another family was given an assortment of prizes announced as worth \$20,000. Their attorney notified us that the value was only \$18,500. Art says, "and they were going to sue us for the other \$1,500. Our attorney is talking to them."

Emcees won't pick the week-after-week semi-professional contestants. "The last woman I'll pick is one who grabs my coat as I go up the aisle with the microphone," Art says. He appreciates shapely legs but is too busy during the show to notice them. He didn't pick a man who waved a sign reading, "I'll do anything," or another who held up a red glove on a long stick. "They looked like Smart Alecks. A good emcee can tell a sharpie from a nice person at 40 feet.
