Reds 30 Miles From Shanghai

SHANGHAI, Friday, April 29 — (AP)—Chinese communist troops are pressing on the railway town of Kunshan, only 30 miles from Shanghai, a Garrison communication said today.

The garrison also admitted a second Red column again was driving south of this front toward Kashing, which controls the railway to fortified Hangchow.

The American President liner President Wilson sailed during the afternoon after taking aboard about 300 persons of all nationalities, including about 150 Americans.

Another 118 Americans sailed aboard the U.S. navy hospital ship repose, presumably for Hong Kong.

About 1,500 Americans remained behind.

Senate Asks Fund Bill Cut

WASHINGTON, April 28 — (AP)—Economy forces grabbed the reins in the senate today and sent the \$2,400,000,000 labor-federal security appropriation back to committee to be cut.

The upset roll-call came on a motion by Sen. Taft (R-Ohio) who pleaded with the senate to establish a "general pattern" of spending costs lest higher taxes "destroy the free enterprise system."

Vernon Williams Dies in Portland

PORTLAND, April 28 — (AP)—Death came last night to Vernon Williams, 55-year old editor of the Oregon Democrat and leader in party politics here. He had been in poor health.

A former member of the state hydroelectric commission and finance director of the state democratic central committee, Williams was active in state and city political campaigns.

\$127,000 Woodburn School Budget Oked

Russian U.N. Expert Quits

NEW YORK, April 28 — (AP)—Russia's ranking man in the United Nations administration, Assistant Secretary-General Arkady A. Sobolev, resigned today to rejoin the Soviet foreign ministry in Moscow.

Sobolev is regarded in some Western circles as an advocate of closer relations with the Western powers.

Secretary-General Trygve Lie announced the resignation, which had been expected since Sobolev went back to Moscow January 21. Lie said the reason was ill health in Sobolev's family.

Fleming to Head Maritime Board

WASHINGTON, April 28 — (AP)—Maj. Gen. Philip B. Fleming, a former army engineer, was chosen by President Truman today to head the United States Maritime commission.

Then, the president announced that Jess Larson, war assets administrator, will succeed Fleming as administrator of the federal works agency.
