

Patton Streaks to Unofficial Records in 100 and 220 Dashes

Fastest Human In Great Day

Times of 9.1, 20.2 Recorded for Star

LOS ANGELES, May 7.—(AP)—Mel Patton of the University of Southern California bettered the world record for the 220 yard dash today with a sprint of 20.2 seconds, shortly after he ran the fastest 100 yards in history, unofficially.

Officials at the dual meet between USC and UCLA held at the UCLA track, said they would certify the 220-yard performance and apply for acceptance of the mark.

Patton 45 minutes earlier ran the 100 yard dash in 9.1 seconds with a 6.5 MPH wind behind his back.

The wind gauge for the 220, however, registered 3.3 miles per hour which is under the 4.473 allowable.

His time of 20.2 bettered the accepted world record set by Jesse Owens of 20.3 made May 25, 1935 at Ann Arbor, Mich.

Both the 100 and 220 were run over a straight course.

Larry Houston, local AAU official, said Patton's 220 performance "looked good" for certification.

Patton holds the official world record of 9.3 seconds for the 100-yard dash. His performance was approved this week by the International Amateur Athletic Federation.

Five times caught him in 9.1 seconds for his 100 and two previous time seconds flat. In the former three watches showed 20.2 and a fourth 20.1.

Salem Keglers Capture Lead

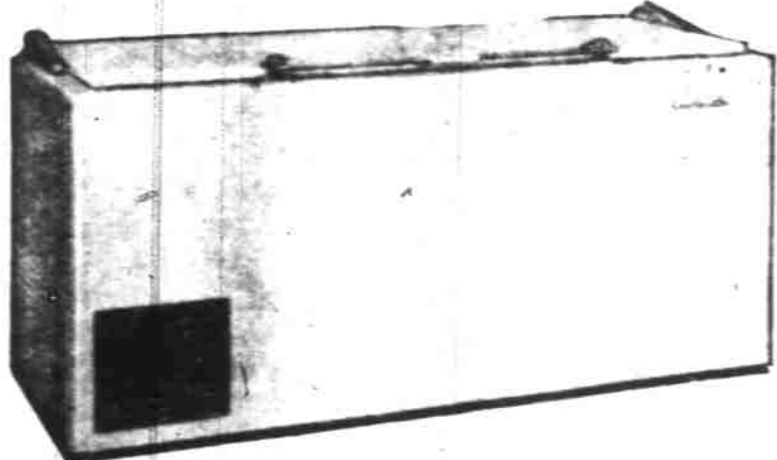
