### THE ART WORLD

Salem art association has scheduled more showings of special films for this month and next. A group of famous German motion pictures is listed for showing Thursday, May 12 at Waller hall. Included will be "The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari".

On June 12, Mrs. Clifford Taylor will show pictures which she took of gardens of the south, including many from the famous Natchez area of Mississippi. All the showings are free, and the public is invited.

**Manuscripts Exhibited**  
A rare collection of manuscript pages dating back to 1122 A. D. is on display at the Elstrom gallery, and will be hung for two weeks. It is the property of Otto Eye of Cleveland, Ohio, nationally known collector of ancient manuscripts.

The majority of the manuscripts are with Latin texts, and with illumination in color. Most of the work was done by monks, sometimes one single manuscript being the life work of a man.

Several full page illustrations are included in the exhibit. Notably "Flight into Egypt, Ascent of the Virgin, Adoration of the Magi" and illustrations from Persian poetry.

The exhibition, which was displayed for years in the Cleveland museum, was brought to the west coast by the efforts of Mrs. E. J. Taylor, head of the art department of Oregon State college.
