

'Frustration Reaction' Said

WASHINGTON, May 12 -(AP) Are you wondering why the Washington Senators are playing baseball like champions? It's simply a "reaction to frustra-

That's the explanation given one of the nation's top psychiatrists, Dr. Winfred Overholser, superintendent at St. Elizabeth's mental hospital here. The Senators were just frustrated, said the doctor, when they lost seven games straight at the beginning of the season. Their reaction is what's handed Chicago two lickings, St. Louis

Asked if this reaction is only temporary. Overholser replied: "No, not necessarily. It could go

on indefinitely." "When an individual suffers heating after beating, there are two courses open," he said. "He can either lie down and admit defeat or get up and fight back." He added, "This is not restrict-ed to an individual. It applies to groups, teams and even armies. Certainly this ball club is fight-


