## Stock Goes Up

Eyes Preakness win.Fast Go Seen  
For Preakness

BALTIMORE, May 12 (AP)—The rain has all blown away from old hilltop and a forecast for clear and sunny Preakness weather sky-rocketed the stock of the two "speed" horses — Capot and Noble Impulse.

This turn in events, after an earlier prediction of an off track just about fixed the field at eight horses for the \$75,000-added classic at Pimlico Saturday.

The good weather once apparently eliminated one probable starter, Christian stable's Parliamant who was scheduled to run only if the going got heavy. The weatherman's welcome change in signals was fine news for most trainers and owners, and with a fast track this 73rd Preakness could develop into a race with tactics not unlike last week's Kentucky Derby.

Five of the derby field are here for the Maryland star attraction, headed by Calumet farm's Ponder — surprise winner at Louisville. The others are Greentree stable's Capot, second in the derby; Isidore Bieler's, Palestinian, third; Clifford Moore's Old Rockport, fourth; and Mrs. Ada L. Rice's Model Cadet, seventh.

Three others who passed up the derby complete the lineup. They are Crispin Oglebay's speedy Noble Impulse, King ranch's Curandero, and Mrs. E. H. Ellison, Jr.'s Sun Baham.

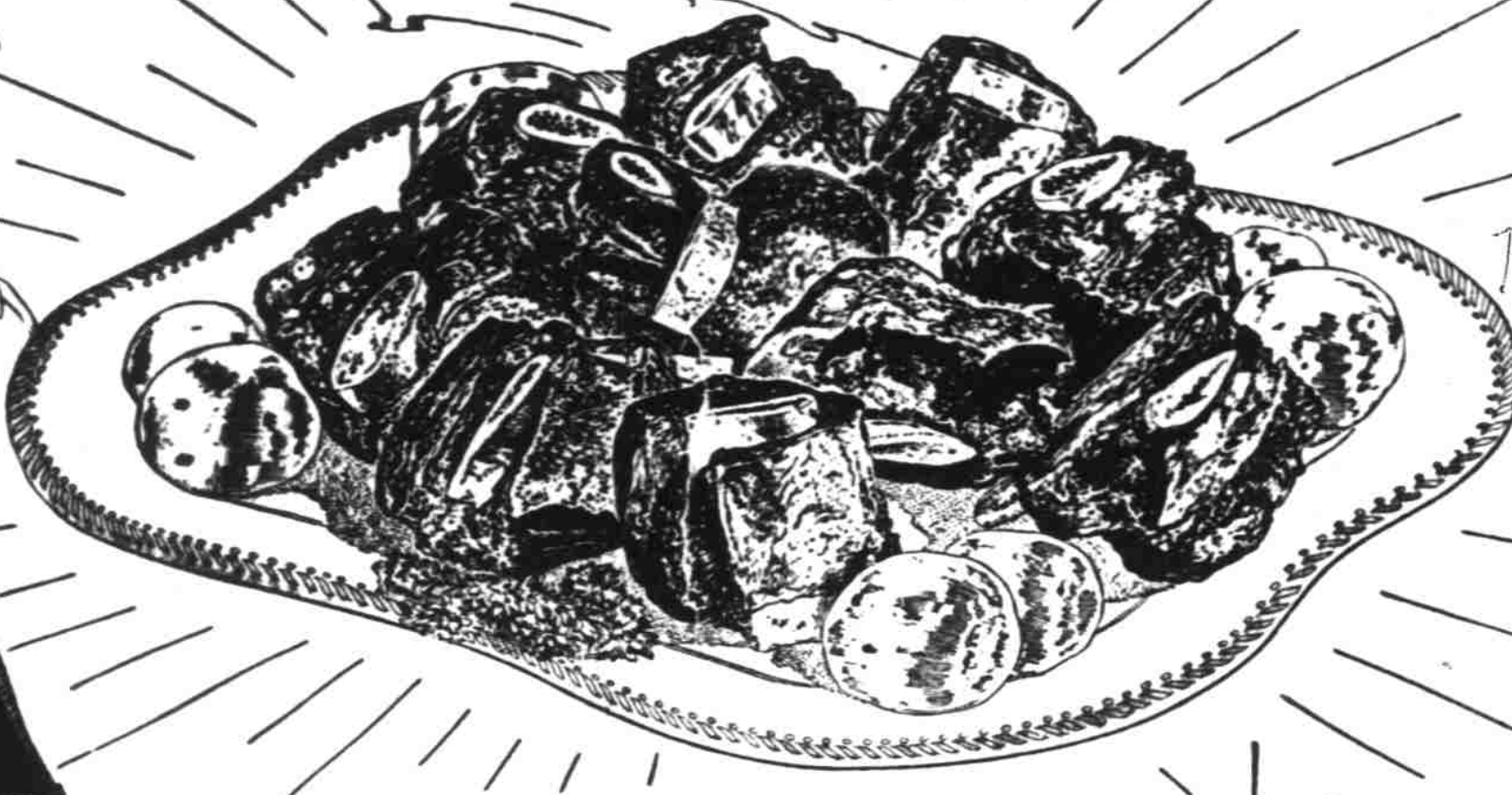
PGE Asks to
