West Salem Council Votes Time Change

West Salem will go into the daylight savings time camp Monday along with Salem and several other Willamette valley cities. This was decided along with other matters of business at a special session of the West Salem city council Friday night. Most of the council members did not favor the time change, but felt they should go along with Salem and other communities, explained Mayor Walter Musgrave.

About 1,300 feet of 8-inch pipe left over after constructing a water-line across the Willamette river between Salem and West Salem about two years ago was sold last night. The city paid 71 cents a foot for the pipe from the war assets administration.

The council also approved sale of a lot on the corner of Patterson avenue and 5th street to Carl A. Gerlinger. Price on the 100 by 100 foot lot was \$2,000. Gerlinger owns the surrounding property.

Nebraska Man Nominated for Navy Secretary

WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—Francis Patrick Matthews, Nebraska lawyer and businessman, is President Truman's choice to succeed John L. Sullivan as Secretary of the Navy.

The nomination of the prominent 62-year-old Roman catholic layman went to the senate today. It came as military and congressional circles still buzzed with Sullivan's wrathful resignation.

At Omaha, Matthews told reporters that he recognized unification of the armed forces was the big problem. He believes, he said, that navy prestige need not be impaired in the process. He promised to maintain naval traditions.

Matthews was a Truman supporter in the 1948 campaign. He headed the Nebraska state delegation to the democratic convention, and the group backed the president.

Mr. Truman today nominated Gordon Gray, now Assistant Secretary of the Army, to be Undersecretary of the Army.

U.N. Approves News Charter

NEW YORK, Saturday, May 14 (AP)—The United Nations assembly approved early today the first world convention of the international transmission of news and the right of correction.

The vote was 33 to 8 with 13 abstentions. Seven countries were absent. The U. S. favored the plan, the Russian bloc opposed it. The convention ultimately will become a treaty covering the rights and privileges of foreign correspondents.

The words "right of correction" in its title refer to machinery it contains for one member government to submit to another corrections of news material it considers injurious.

Shipping Point Inspection Wins Industry Support

Oregon industry is anxious to cooperate in improving the federal state shipping point inspection service. It developed at the first state-wide conference between industry representatives and shipping point inspection service officials here Friday.

Among industry representatives were Robert Shinn and A. F. Hayes, both of Salem. The industry group offered a number of suggestions for improving service which annually handles inspections of approximately 30,000 carloads of produce moving out of the state.

Eastern Title Decided Today

CALDWELL, Idaho, May 13 (AP)—Whitman college scored four runs in the 11th inning to defeat the College of Idaho baseball team 9 to 5 today.

The two teams will meet again tomorrow afternoon. If College of Idaho wins, the Coyotes will clinch the eastern half of the northwest conference championship. If Whitman wins, a doubleheader will be necessary tomorrow.

Plywood Mill Official Dies In Car Wreck

LEBANON, May 13 (AP)—Allen A. Jones, 43, secretary-treasurer of the Western Veneer Plywood plants at Lebanon and Sweet Home, was fatally injured today, Coroner Glenn Huston said.

Jones apparently fell asleep while driving on business to Sweet Home. His car crashed into a guard rail and overturned on the South Santiam highway two miles from Sweet Home. Jones was alone.

Jones, whose home is in Portland, organized the plywood firm in cooperation with two brothers.

Plan to Divide Italy Colonies Wins Support

LAKE SUCCESS, May 13 (AP)—An American-backed plan for cutting up Italy's old colonial empire among Britain, France, Italy and Ethiopia was approved today by the United Nations political committee.

The vote was 34 to 16 on the plan that grew out of British-Italian talks in London last week. The 59-nation general assembly is expected to act finally on the project late tomorrow or perhaps as late as Monday.

The majority approved settlement provides for:

1. Britain to stay in Cirenica as administering authority for a United Nations trusteeship.

2. Italy would return in 1951 as the dominant power in Tripolitania, where she would administer a U. N. trusteeship.

3. France would administer a U. N. trusteeship over the Fezzan.

4. Italy would administer a trusteeship over Italian Somaliland.

5. All of Libya—Cirenica-Tripolitania—the Fezzan—would become independent in 10 years unless the U. N. assembly decides otherwise before the end of the 10 years.

6. All of Eritrea except the western province would be incorporated into Ethiopia under outright annexation.

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R. W. Tucker, Aumsville, Dies

AUMSVILLE, May 13—Richard W. Tucker, 87, who lived on a small farm just north of here, died Friday morning in a Salem hospital.

Funeral services will be held Sunday at 2 p.m. in the Weddle home at Stayton. Interment will be in Aumsville cemetery. He had been in the hospital for about the past six weeks.

Son of early Oregon pioneers, Tucker was born here March 4, 1867. He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Nellie Coyle of Tillamook and Alpha of Eugene and a brother, Frank Tucker, 86, of Aumsville. A sister, Jennie Van Nuy, died in Salem several weeks ago.

Breaking of Rib Revives 'Dead' Man

SANTA MONICA, Calif. May 13 (AP)—A man whose doctor says he was "medically dead" for from 12 to 15 minutes grinned for reporters today and said: "I have a new life insurance policy. I wonder if I can collect on them."

Reid C. Lewis, 46, an armament inspector at Douglas Aircraft here, "died" under an anesthetic a

week ago, said his physician, who declined to permit use of his name. But he was revived, the doctor added, by the shock of breaking a rib.

The surgeon said he is both a Doctor of Medicine and Doctor of Osteopathy.

The doctor gave this explanation of the case: "By every medical criterion of death, he was dead. These are the medical criteria of death: cessation of breathing, no audible heart beat, no discernible blood pressure and the loss of superficial and deep reflexes."

The "death" occurred, said the physician, after injection of the usual amount of sodium pentothol, a commonly used anesthetic, in preparation for an operation. Immediately, the doctor and

his assistant injected Coramine directly into the heart and piped oxygen directly into the lungs, but without result. Then the physician recalled that in some cases of

drowning, the shock of breaking a bone had revived supposed drowning victims. To snapped a rib with his hands, and Lewis' reflexes resumed.
