

NEW YORK, May 17 -(AP)-George D. Widener, president of Belmont Park, said today that he was oppose dto night horse racing and that no stake race was worth more than \$50,000.

"I feel that night racing would do as much damage as off-course betting to our tracks," Widener told the annual convention of the National Association of State Racing commissioners.

The convention adopted a com-

mittee report yesterday opposing any form of off-course betting. Widener said that the five New York tracks fully endorsed the

action. "Night racing would drive out stand-bys in racing for years," he continued:

"Furthermore, I think this competition for high stakes, such as these big \$100,000 races, is bad for the sport. Personally, I think no stake race is worth more than \$50,000. The purses for the other races should be increased
