Salem Heights School Stages Play Program

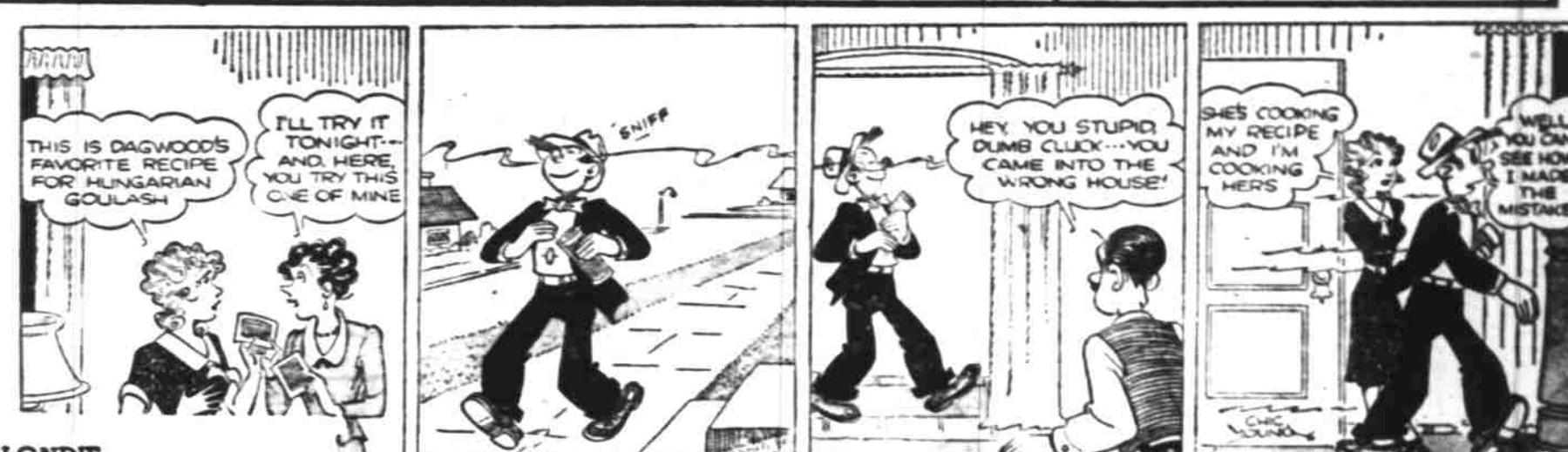
SALEM HEIGHTS — Parents and pre-school children attend play day at the Salem Heights school Friday.
