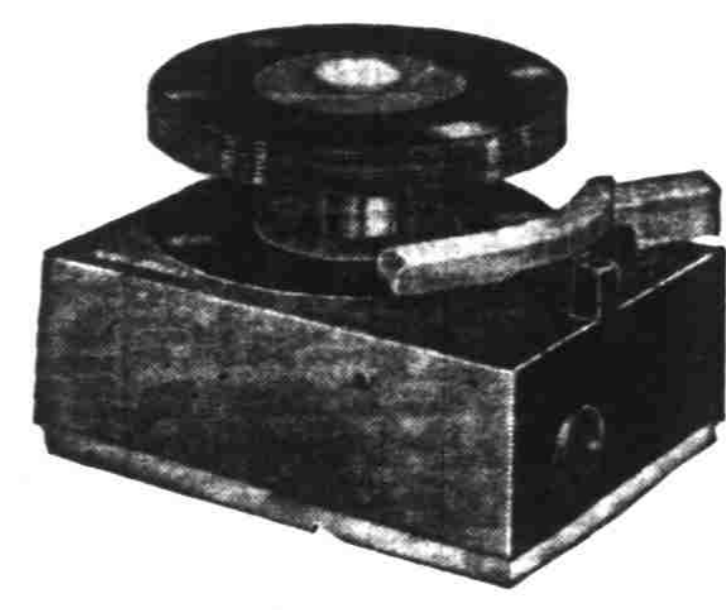
Cemetery Association To Finish Organization
