

Garden Quiets Ring Squabble

Absorbs Both TC's, 29th Century Club

NEW YORK, May 31—(AP)—Madison Square Garden's absorption of both the 20th Century Sporting club and the tournament of champions brought an end Tuesday to a suit over Welterweight Boxing Champion Ray Robinson.

Promoter Mike Jacobs, erstwhile head of the now defunct 20th Century organization, had sued to restrain Robinson from fighting for the tournament of champions, formerly a rival promotion agency.

But when the suit was called for trial Tuesday before Supreme Court Justice Edward R. Koch, it was discontinued by agreement. Benjamin C. Milner, attorney for Jacobs, said that since Jacobs had sold his interests in the Garden and joined forces with that organization, which then purchased the tournament of champions, "there no longer exists a diversity of interests."

If his suit, which named the rival club and the boxer, under his real name of Walter Smith, Jacobs said that on October 24, 1945, he signed a five-year contract with the welterweight for his services.

Last April 7, Jacobs declared, he learned that Robinson had signed with the tournament of champions to defend his title against Kid Gavilan of Cuba on June 21.

Robinson and Gavilan still are scheduled to meet on that date at the Polo grounds under Garden promotion, but both have refused to sign articles with the state athletic commission because of dissatisfaction over television rights for the fight.

PARIS, May 31—(AP)—The international equestrian federation took the Olympic dressage championship away from Sweden Tuesday and awarded it to France. Sweden won the event, limited to commissioned army officers, at the 1948 London games. But the federation ruled that Sweden purposely evaded the rules. It charged that Lt. G. Persson, who rode for Sweden, was a sergeant who was given a commission by royal decree in order to make him eligible for the games.

Curious Tarpon Smashes Boat

BOCA GRANDE, Fla., May 31—(AP)—A 177-pound tarpon apparently decided Monday to see what it looks like inside a boat.

The fish, uncaused and unaided, leaped into a 25-foot cruiser. Its impact and struggles shattered a fishing chair and damaged part of the deck flooring. It was brought under control after 15 minutes but not until it broke off part of its tail.

Ted Bylaska, the cruiser's guide, said the fish would have weighed about 180 pounds before losing its tail. The lost piece of tail left its weight at 177 pounds—equal to the largest tarpon caught in Florida waters this year.
