LONDON, June 3—(AP)—Big Jack Kramer and little Bobby Riggs, former American amateur singles champions, teamed to win the world professional doubles title tonight.

It took the two Los Angeles swingers a five sets blowout before they licked Pancho Segura of Ecuador and Dinky Pails of Australia, 3-6, 4-6, 6-3, 6-4, 6-1.

Tomorrow night, Riggs and Kramer will face each other on opposite sides of the net to decide the singles championship.

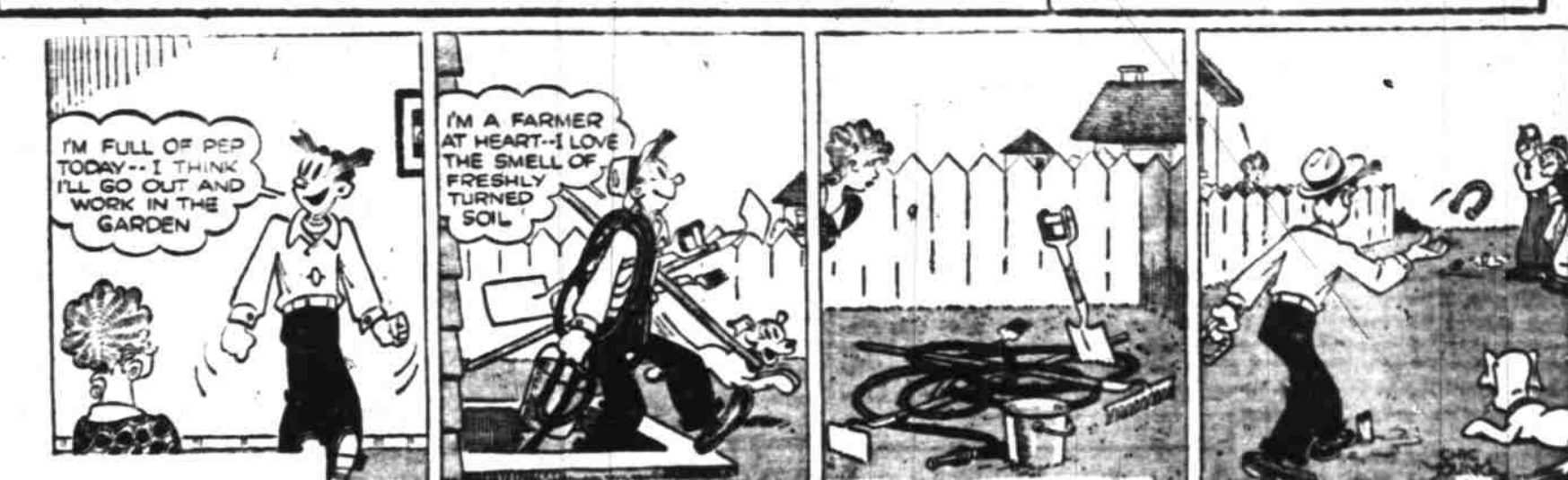

Annual Pacific Association Cinder Show Scheduled Today

BERKELEY, Calif., June 3—(AP)—Time honored events such as the 10,000 meter run, the hammer throw and 1500 meter walk have disappeared from the college track and field scene out this way. But they will be hauled out tomorrow as part of the annual Pacific association (AAU) championships.

World record quarter mile dash holder Herb McKenley of Jamaica will be among a group of top stars appearing in the 1949 renewal of one of the oldest meets in the far west.

McKenley set his 46 second flat time here last year. A high school boy, Ollie Matson, now a University of San Francisco freshman, pressed McKenley to the world mark, on the University of California's Edwards track stadium. Matson will be trying again.

Lloyd LaBeach of Panama, who won the 100 and 220-yard sprints here last year, again will be favored in those events.

Bob Richards of the Illinois Athletic club is expected to top the pole vaulting brigade but hardly is likely to better the Pacific association record. The mark is 15 feet 6 1/2 inches, set by Cornelius Warmerdam. Tom Montgomery of the San Francisco Olympic club will be on hand to defend his P.A. title in the hammer throw and 56-pound weight toss. Walter Boehm of the Olympic club looks like a cinch to retain his 1500 meters walk laurels. The hip wigglers are as funny as some comedy acts.

Besides the guest stars, McKenley, La Beach and Richards, strong representation will be furnished by Stanford, the Olympic club, San Jose State, Fresno State, College of the Pacific, California Aggies and the University of California, whose athletes will run unattached.

Salmon Trolling Dates Changed

PORTLAND, June 3—(AP)—The state fish commission decided today to permit trolling for Chinook salmon only from March 15 to October 31 instead of all year around. A companion proposal would change the silver salmon trolling season from the present July 1-November 15 period to June 15-October 31.

The suggested regulations drew no opposition at a public hearing today, and the commission said a formal order would be made soon.
