

Snead Nears Prize Record

U. S. Open Money May Top 1938 Season

CHICAGO, June 5-(AP)—If Samuel Jackson Snead can bag the \$2,000 top prize in the U. S. Open at Medinah, Ill., this week, he'll be within halting distance of his money-winning championship season of 1938.

That year Slammin' Sammy collected \$19,534 to top the professional golf field.

As Snead moves in for a shot at an unprecedented triple crown, his year's earnings totaled \$12,319. Last year, the unpredictable Samba collected only \$7,130. Sam hit the jackpot this year with his \$2,500 first place grab in the PGA National and \$2,750 in winning the Masters, not to mention \$2,000 for copping the Greensboro Open.

Snead's PGA triumph enabled him to wrest first place in the money-winning column from Lloyd Mangrum, who now has \$11,457. Snead's feat of winning the Masters and PGA titles in the same year never before was achieved.

In third place with \$10,050 was Johnny Palmer of Baden, N.C., Snead's PGA meet title match victim, who also maintains the Vanion trophy point lead with an average round of 69.59 strokes.

Carv Middleeiff tumbled from second to fourth in the latest PGA money-counting with a total of \$9,999. Jimmy Demaret replaced E. J. (Dutch) Harrison in the fifth spot with \$7,374.

Mvorgum captured the lead in the Ryder Cup point competition, his 1948 dropping injured Ben Hogan to second with 1028.

Bounding out the top ten money winners are Harrison, \$7,312; Bob Hamilton, \$4,982; Jim Ferrer, \$4,895; Fred Haas, Jr., \$4,647; and Jim Turnesa \$4,097.

'Spotlighters' Again Active In Elkhorn Area; Deer Dead

ELKHORN, June 5-(Special)—The 1949 Oregon deer hunting season won't lawfully open until fall, but culprits in this area apparently believe it has arrived unannounced.

"Spotlighters" have again been in evidence and innumerable deer here have fallen prey to these law breaking night shooters.

A doe and a yearling (see picture) were found nearby in an orchard above the Ray Sischo farm. The doe was dead but the little "towhead" still was alive and suffering with a bullet in its thigh.

Sischo mercifully ended its misery. A third deer had been dressed out nearby.

Buzzards circling just off the Gates Hill road not long ago testified to another night hunter's activities.

A bog four-point buck had been wounded with a small caliber gun and left to die.

Bill Bickett, who has lost several head of beef stock to "spotlighters" bullets last winter reported three alleged night hunters. He was called four times to court to testify against a trio of accused hunters, but the case was dismissed recently for "insufficient evidence."

Many in this area know little of the actions of courts and lawyers, but can too often supply much more than "sufficient evidence" in helpless deer left slaughtered or dying by the recklessness of unlawful "spotlighters."
