SAN FRANCISCO, June 6-(AP)—In a closed hearing in his private chambers, Federal Judge William Denman today considered the case of Jake Bird, 48, sentenced to hang for a killing in Tacoma.

Reminding that football is no longer a game for 60-minute men because of complication of plays, he called it a game of "specialists."

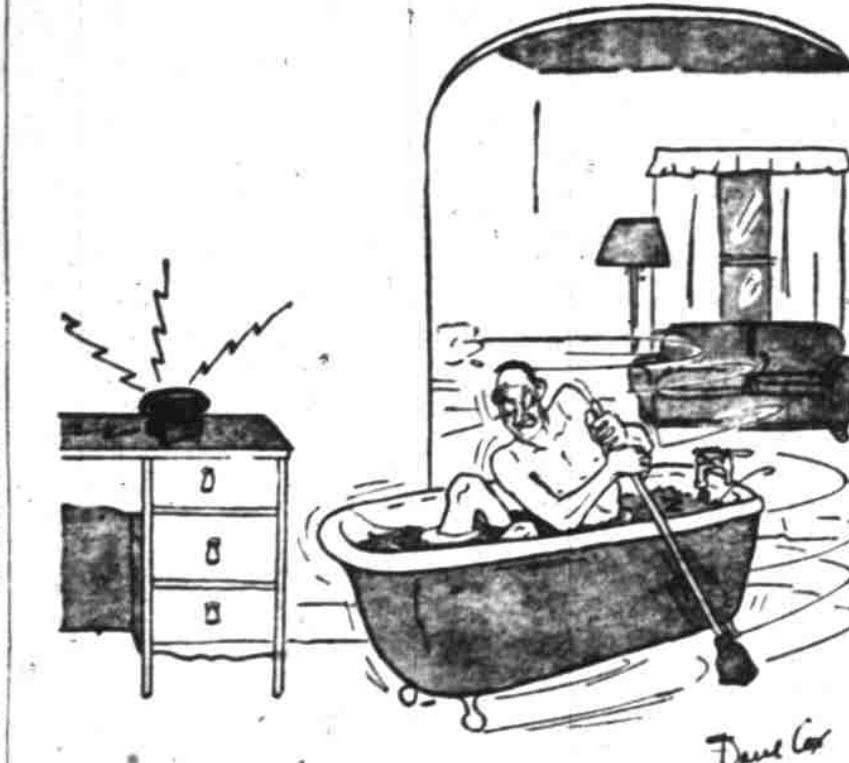
STATIONS BAN MADE

School Bond Sale Allowed

School district 52 of Lane county can sell the rest of its \$400,000 bond issue.

A ruling Monday by Attorney General George Neuner permits the district to proceed with the sales which now total \$165,000, even though another district wants to take over part of district 52. Rex Putnam, state superintendent of schools, had asked whether the proposed boundary changes would make the bond sale illegal.

Whisky Sale Brings Fine

Irzyk told the court he had purchased the establishment for \$17,500 and had spent \$4,000 in remodeling it for business, even though it will be inundated when the Detroit dam reservoir fills.

3 Sentences Meted Out in Circuit Court

Three men were sentenced Monday in Marion county circuit court on varying charges, and all were placed on probation.

Sentenced were Cromie Davis, who pleaded guilty to obtaining money by false pretenses, six months in county jail suspended for two years' probation; William Dorsey Hardin, Independence, who pleaded guilty to larceny of a truck April 14, sentence suspended and placed on three years' probation; Clayton Roberts, larceny of a car and other equipment from Salem Navigation company warehouse, one year in state penitentiary suspended for three years' probation.

John R. Watson pleaded guilty to larceny of \$174 from the Marian Fox home, 748 Mill st., last July 12, and to obtaining money by false pretenses and was sent to the state hospital for 30 days' observation prior to sentencing.

State penitentiary inmates who appeared were Paul LeRoy Gardner, charged with arson, pleaded innocent; Robert E. Lee, charged with escape, pleaded innocent, trial set for June 13; Clyde L. Maitland, charged with escape, continued to June 20 for plea.

HOLLYWOOD, June 6-(AP)—Metropolitan Opera Singer Dorothy Kirsten threatened today to sue Comedian Milton Berle for burlesquing her talents on his television show.

"It wasn't funny," she fumed. In fact the act "was so horrible," Miss Kirsten said, that the National Broadcasting company has promised to delete that portion of the Berle show before a film of it is presented to west coast audiences Tuesday night.

The burlesque, she explained, goes as follows: Berle and two pudgy assistants appear on the stage and announce that Dorothy Kirsten will sing the drinking song from Verdi's "La Traviata."

At this point, a girl in a "hideous blond wig" comes on and renders a vocal pantomime with a "screaming record" of unknown origin providing the sound effects.

"People think it's my voice," the opera star spluttered. "It's the most horrible thing you ever heard!"
